

CONDUCT OF MOOT COURT PRESENTATIONS

23rd JANUARY – 19th MARCH 2018

Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS) provided a valuable opportunity to the students of B.B.A.LL.B., Semester 4 to hone both their written and oral advocacy skills by organising Moot Court Presentations. The students were divided into nine groups and accordingly nine moot problems based on Family Law and Law of Contract were presented. Each group consisted of six students. Prior to the allotment of cases for moot presentation to each group, a comprehensive training program was scheduled to provide training to the students on various aspects of the moot presentations.

Furthermore, a faculty coordinator was also allocated to each of the nine groups to constantly monitor and provide guidance to the students. As a part of Moot presentations, each student submitted a well-researched individual memorial to the respective faculty coordinator. The students were divided as 'Applicant side' and 'Respondent side' consisting of three students each. The students collectively worked, as a team, to draft the final Applicant Memorial and Respondent Memorial. Following Moot Presentations were conducted:
