JUSTITIA: THE 2ND ANNUAL LEX FIESTA 21ST – 24TH NOVEMBER, 2022 (MONDAY-THURSDAY)

The Court Room Society of Centre for Legal Studies, Gitarattan International Business School hosted its 2nd law fest, Justitia 2022- The 2nd Annual Lex Fiesta. The brochure was released 2 months prior to the competition. It was a matter of immense pride for CLS- GIBS that the lex fiesta received an overwhelming response from different universities across the country, like Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, The ICAI University Jaipur, National Law University Jodhpur, NALSAR, Himachal Pradesh National Law University, Amity Law School Noida, Central University of South Bihar and many more.



The first day began with the inaugural ceremony. Sh. Sushant Changotra, Special Secretary, Delhi State Legal Service Authority was the Chief Guest. After the welcome address by, Prof. Dr. P. M. Johri, Director, GIBS, the honorable Chief Guest shared his insightful professional experiences of

working in judicial system. He motivated all the students to build upon their skills and thrive in their desired fields. He motivated students to grab the maximum experience from these competitions. The inaugural session concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Neelam Seam, Programme Coordinator (Law), GIBS.

After inauguration, the preliminary rounds of Mediation Competition began, wherein twenty teams contested for qualifying for the semi-finals. All participants presented their negotiations before their respective judges in various rooms. Esteemed panel of judge helped in choosing the best teams which were to compete in the semi-finals. Finally, Semi final Round was conducted and two teams emerged as finalists.

On the second day of the lex fiesta, the final round of mediation took place. Both the teams showcased their skills. A 3 Judge Panel consisting Mr. Manish Jain who is Secretary of Delhi State Legal Service Authority, Mr. Dharmendra, partner in Maheshwari & Co. and Ms. Priya Khanna from IIAM Delhi was set up. After the final round of mediation, registration and orientation of law quiz and debate was done. Two preliminary rounds were conducted in the classrooms and the final round of debate was conducted before a three judge bench of Dr. B.K. Raina who is Professor in Delhi University, Col. Vashisht, Advocate and Raj Kumar Chauhan who is a Senior Advocate. The topic of preliminary round was Preliminary Round: Patriarchy and Prejudice: Paving way to Women Subordination and the topic for the final round of debate competition was Electoral Reform in India - One Nation One Election. Simultaneously, law quiz was conducted in the auditorium. There were three rounds: Audio-visual round, buzzer round and rapid fire round. Twenty teams competed in these rounds and then a winner was decided.



On Day 3, the day started with the registration of youth parliament and 28 students competed in it in the presence of three Executive Board members. The Agenda for the parliament was to tackle the Rising Unemployment in India with special emphasis on Agneepath Scheme.

Simultaneously, the National Law Olympiad was conducted in the online mode. A tie breaker round was also conducted.



On Day 4, youth parliament was conducted in the morning and after the conclusion of youth parliament, the winners were announced in the valedictory ceremony. Afzal Wani sir, Vice-Chairman of Institute of Objective Studies, was the chief guest of the valedictory ceremony. Winners of all the events were announced and awarded prizes and trophy in the valedictory ceremony.
