

INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO “CENTRAL ADMINISTRATIVE TRIBUNAL, NEW DELHI”

On

22nd and 23TH DECEMBER, 2022



Gitarattan International Business School organized an Industrial visit to the Central Administrative Tribunal, New Delhi on 22nd and 23th December, 2022. The visit was organized for BALLB seventh semester students to enhance the knowledge of their domain. The visit was organized for making the students aware of the functioning of the High Court and to observe the proceedings. The key aim behind arranging the trip was to boost the confidence of students by helping them attain industry-relevant knowledge, which would come to their aid in blooming into successful lawyers. Gibbs strongly believe that providing the students with hands-on experience of live court proceedings can work wonders in instilling in them a sense of discipline and responsibility and also acquaint them with court etiquette.

In this visit, students were taken to the Central Administrative Tribunal, New Delhi. Mr. Sulabh Rastogi, Joint Registrar instructed the students about the Rules and the decorum to be maintained inside the Tribunal Premises. Students were sent to different court rooms in the group of 4 students to observe the proceedings in the courts. In the court rooms, matters were mostly related to Service Matters. In one court, a matter was related to cancellation of previous order and arguments were going on between lawyers. It was a wonderful experience for the students to hear these arguments. Along with this, the queries of the students about how to see the item number going on in the Court, to check the cause list and see the Name of the case, how the appearance is given by the advocates, and were told about the basic the etiquettes how to enter and exit the court by greeting the Judges.

The Students observed the proceedings of Court No.4 the Bench of Mrs. Pratima K Gupta. They have noted down the proceedings of the Court for e.g. Anuj Dabas the student of BA LLB 9th Semester noted down the proceedings of Court No.3 the Bench of Hon'ble Mr. Manish Garg wherein the item no. 3, O.A No. 4887/2022 *Raman Singh Vs Union of India* was going on and the order was noted by her since Appeal has been filed, against the departmental proceedings. In CM APPL. 45756/2022 Application of stay was filed. Court ordered no stay on Penalty. The learned counsel for the petitioner did not press the present application therefore the application was, accordingly, dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file a similar application if the need so arises after completion of pleadings. and in the main M.A 887/2022 the order was given “ Upon the petitioner taking steps, issue notice to respondent through all permissible modes. Counter-affidavit, if any, be filed within six weeks. Rejoinder thereto, if any, be filed within four. Therefore the matter was listed 25.02.2023. In Item no.6 O.A 75/2020 - *Bhupendra Singh And Ors Vs Union of India*. The Court observed that Respondent No.1 is at Tihar and the petition is not maintainable. The petitioners have not approached High Court. The Counsel for Respondent No.2 is the new appearance and prayed for time to complete her paper book and

make submissions therefore the case was listed on 14.01.2023. She also observed the proceedings in Court No. 1 the bench of Hon'ble MR. ASHISH KALIA item No. 11, O.A 11/2019 *Seema Bhalotia Vs Commissioner, North Delhi Municipal Corporation And Ors.* Likewise matters were observed by the other students as well.
