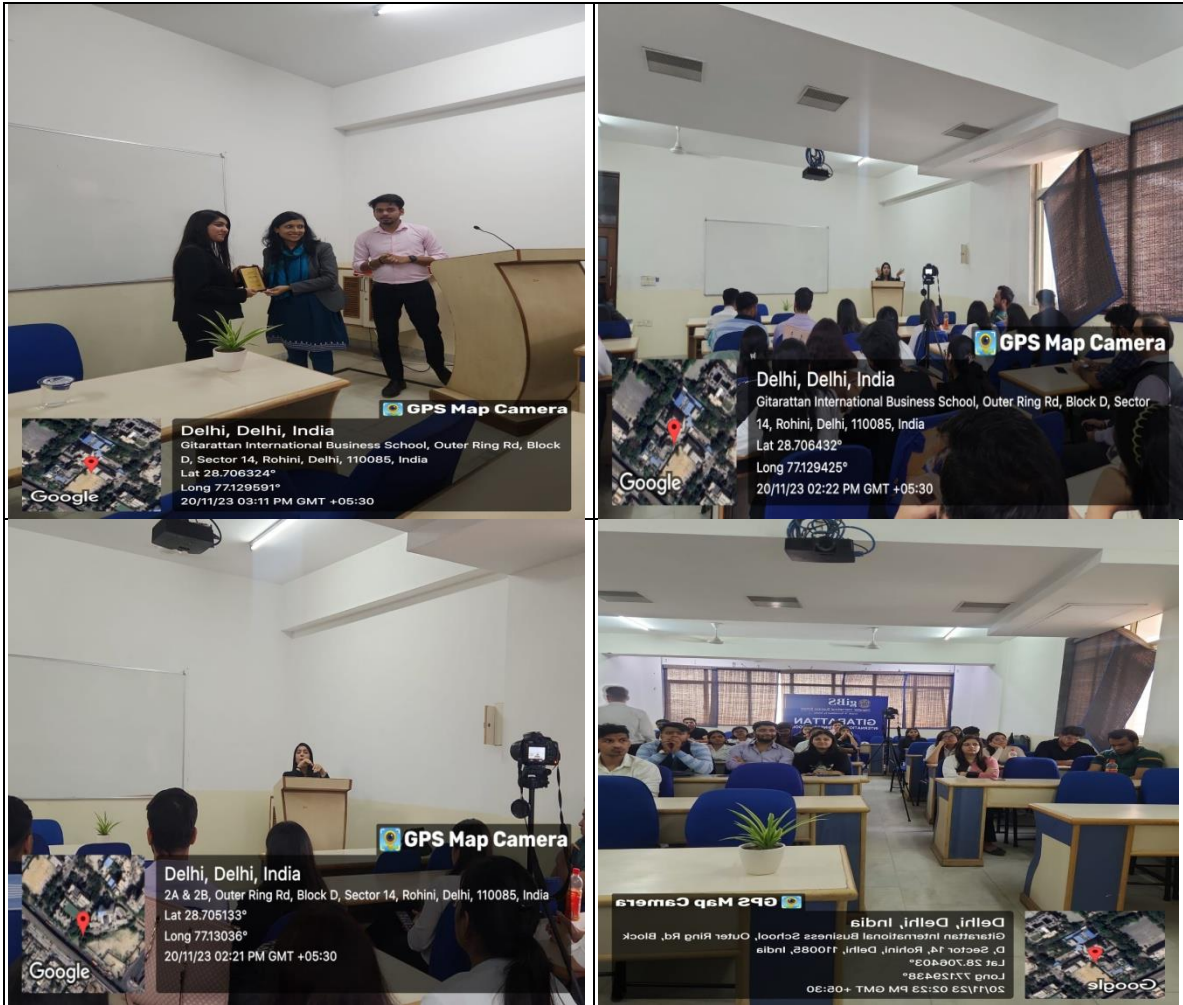


ALUMNI LECTURE SERIES (ALS)
“FIRST THREE MINUTES OF INTERVIEW”

An Alumni Lecture Series was organised by IPC on “First Three Minutes of Job Interview”, on 20th November 2023(Monday). The session broadly covered the essentials of how to crack the job interview and how the first three minutes are crucial. The resource person

for the session was Ms. Sejal Kamra, an alumnus of GIBS, who shared valuable insights on this session, with the 3rd semester MBA and MBA IB students.

The session was started by Dr. Priti Sambhalwal, IIPC, who introduced the guest and delivered the welcome address. Dr. Mahjabin Banu presented the guest with green welcome. The session was then taken over by the resource person for the session Ms. Sejal Kamra, Talent Acquisition Specialist, Vaco Binary Semantics LLP. She addressed the concerns of students on how to answer the questions like tell me about yourself, talking about failures, why did you chose this course, how to justify low grades, how to negotiate salary, etc. She shared a few tips like how to be specific, stay positive and be precise in the job interview. She emphasized the importance of eye contact, smiling and staying disciplined. She also shared few possible rejection situations and how to deal with that scenario.

Dr. Mahjabin Banu extended a vote of thanks to the resource persons and congratulated the team IIPC for their efforts and organizing the event seamlessly. The students benefited highly from the event.
