CLS-GIBS, successfully conducted Human Rights Day on the topic “Human Rights and Genocide” on 8th December, 2023, Friday in the college Auditorium.

The event was graced with the presence of Honorable Guest, Dr Anthony Raju, Advocate at Supreme Court of India. He is also the founder of India National Human Rights Protection Council Delhi. Dr Anthony Raju is internationally accredited Human Rights activist and a TEDx Speaker. The guest was welcomed by our Director Prof. Dr. Vikas Nath with a sapling.

Dr Raju began with giving an introduction to Human rights, both what they mean in practice and their normative background. He enlightened the students about the intersections between news media and human rights in the context of the existing human rights framework. He encompassed a wide array of ethical, legal, and social dimensions, making them a subject of paramount importance for law students and legal professionals. He emphasized on the fundamental provisions of international human rights law and evolving case laws of human rights organs relating to media freedom and responsibilities reveals that existing gaps and underspecified obligations render problematic the normative guidance offered by the framework in addressing the pertinent human rights issues.

Dr. Raju concluded his lecture by emphasizing on the importance of Human rights and Values of tolerance, equality and respect can help us reduce the friction within society.

It is vital therefore that people everywhere should strive to understand what human rights are. Putting human rights ideas into practice can help us create the kind of society we want to live in. He discussed the ongoing situation in Israel wherein UN's intervention as it demanded the

immediate humanitarian ceasefire in the Gaza strip. The role United Nations play in keeping up with the human right both internationally and under domestic laws of a country.

The lecture had strength of 240 students who were intrigued to attend as the topic was an interesting. The session was very interactive as the guest and students were asking questions and responding.

Our Director, Prof. Dr. Vikas Nath, thanked the Hon'ble Guest and presented a memento to him.
