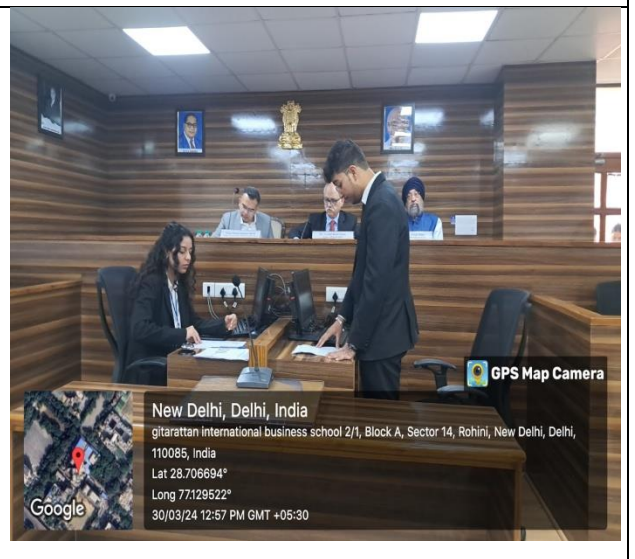
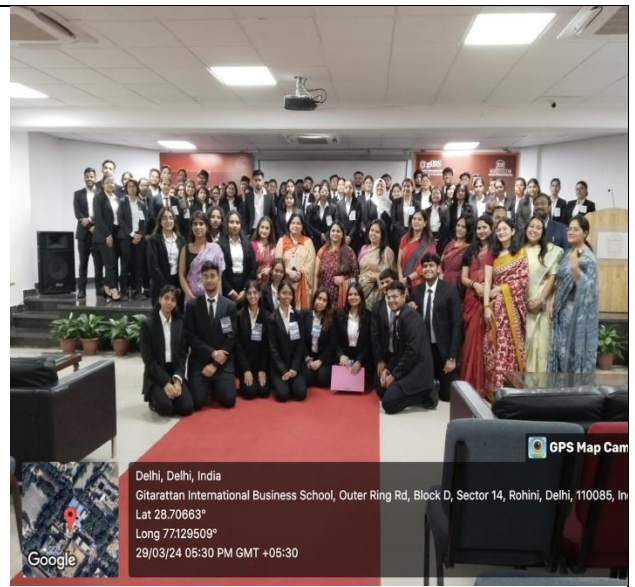


6TH NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION 29TH - 30TH MARCH 2024



The Court Room Society of Centre for Legal Studies, Gitarattan International Business School, proudly convened its 6th National Moot Court Competition on March 29th and 30th, 2024. This prestigious event, preceded by the release of the moot proposition a month in advance, attracted a diverse array of participants from renowned universities such as RMNLU Lucknow, SLS Pune, Christ NCR, UPES, and many more, reflecting the competition's national prominence.

The Inaugural Ceremony commenced with the esteemed presence of Shri Om Prakash Saini, a respected figure in the legal community as a Retired District and Sessions Judge. His address, rich with insights garnered from years of judicial experience, set an inspiring tone for the event. Following his speech, Director Prof. (Dr.) Vikas Nath delivered a motivating address, encouraging participants to embrace the challenges ahead and strive for excellence in their advocacy skills.

With the formal inauguration by Vice Chairman Anirudh Jindal, the competition officially began, signaling the start of the preliminary rounds. Divided into two slots to accommodate the substantial number of participating teams, preliminary rounds provided a platform for aspiring legal minds to showcase their research, advocacy, and critical thinking skills.

After rigorous deliberation, four standout teams—JIMS Noida, GLA Mathura, UPES, and VIPS—earned their place in the semi-finals, marking their advancement in the competition and setting the stage for even fiercer competition ahead.

The semi-final rounds witnessed intense courtroom drama, as participants presented their arguments before a panel of distinguished judges. Advocates Dr. Surendra Hooda, Rishipal Singh, along with Shri R.S. Goswami and Advocate Shri Satnarain Sharma, scrutinized the legal acumen and presentation skills of the competing teams, ensuring that only the best would proceed to the final round.

In the culminating showdown, VIPS and JIMS emerged as the finalists, earning the opportunity to present their cases before a panel of eminent jurists. The final round judges, comprising Shri Laxmi Kant Gaur (Former Judge), Major Piyush Thakran (Former Judge Advocate General, Indian Army), and

Shri Baljit Singh Dhir (Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India), presided over the proceedings with utmost diligence and discernment.

Amidst electrifying courtroom exchanges, VIPS emerged triumphant, clinching the championship title and garnering a plethora of accolades, including a cash prize of Rs. 35,000, trophies, hampers, and coveted internships from esteemed knowledge partners BBS Legal. Meanwhile, JIMS secured the runner-up position, receiving a cash prize of Rs. 25,000, along with trophies and hampers.

Acknowledging excellence across various facets of advocacy, the competition also conferred accolades upon individual participants and teams in additional categories. GLA Mathura received the distinction of Best Mooter, while LPU's exemplary research efforts earned them the title of Best Researcher. Notable memorials crafted by SLS Pune and Amity University, Madhya Pradesh, were recognized as the Best Memorial (Respondent) and Best Memorial (Petitioner), respectively.

Each category winner received cash prizes and Certificate of Merit, underscoring the significance of their contributions to the competition's success. Best Researcher and Mooter awardees were presented with Rs. 10,000 each, while recipients of Best Memorial (Respondent and Petitioner) received Rs. 5,000 each in addition to their certificates.

The distinguished judges for the final round graced the Valedictory Ceremony, offering profound insights and reflections on the competition's proceedings. Their words of wisdom resonated deeply with the audience, serving as a fitting conclusion to an intellectually stimulating event.

In closing, heartfelt appreciation was extended to the dedicated organizing committee, comprising both students and faculty members, whose tireless efforts ensured the seamless execution of the competition. As the resonant strains of the National Anthem filled the air, participants departed with a sense of accomplishment and camaraderie, enriched by their experiences and newfound connections within the legal fraternity.
