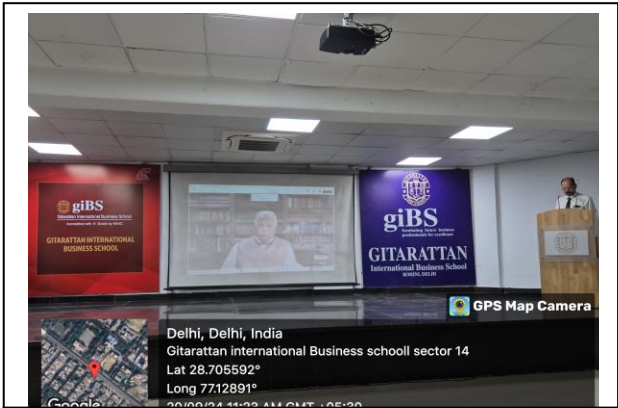
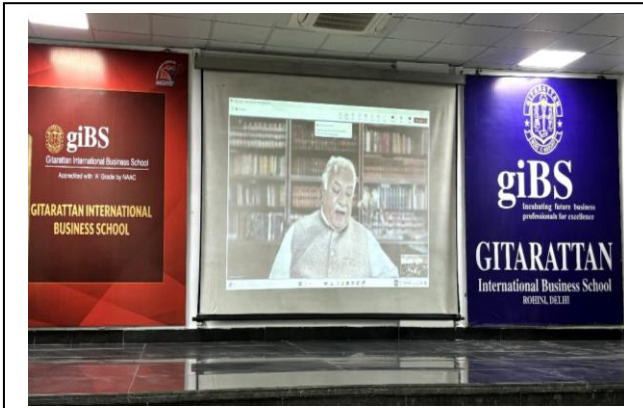


**LEGAL RECOGNITION OF NON-TRADITIONAL FAMILY STRUCTURES, ADOPTION LAWS, AND RIGHTS OF NON-BIOLOGICAL PARENTS**

Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS) organized a Jurist Day for 3rd-semester students of Integrated BALLB (H) and Integrated BALLB (H) on 20.09.2024, focusing on the topic of “Legal Recognition of Non-Traditional Family Structures, Adoption Laws, and Rights of Non-

Biological Parents.” The event featured Mr. Anil Malhotra, an Advocate at the Supreme Court of India, as the keynote speaker, who provided an in-depth analysis of these evolving legal areas.

The lecture began with an introduction to the topic, highlighting the increasing relevance of non-traditional family structures in modern society. As the concept of family continues to evolve, legal systems across the world are facing challenges in recognizing and protecting the rights of individuals in such structures. 
Mr. Malhotra then proceeded to discuss the unrestricted rights of Hindus to adopt, as outlined in the Hindu Adoption and Maintenance Act, setting the foundation for understanding adoption in a broader legal context. He explained the intricacies of the adoption process, emphasizing the role of the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) in facilitating and regulating adoptions. Mr. Malhotra also expanded on the scope of international adoptions, addressing the complexities and challenges involved, particularly in cross-border adoption cases.

A significant part of the lecture was dedicated to explaining the Juvenile Justice Act and its role in protecting the rights of adopted children. He also touched on various international conventions that safeguard the rights of children and discussed the legal standing of non-biological parents within the framework of both national and international law.


The event concluded with a lively question-answer session, where students raised questions about adoption laws, the legal status of non-biological parents, and the implications of non-traditional family structures. Mr. Malhotra addressed these queries thoughtfully, offering insights based on his vast legal experience.

The session was a valuable opportunity for students to gain a deeper understanding of the legal challenges and opportunities related to family structures, adoption, and child rights in today's society.
