

## “SKILL DEVELOPMENT”

*(UNDER NSS 10-DAYS SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL CAMP)*

The NSS Unit of GIBS, in collaboration with Nitya Foundation, organized a Skill Development Workshop at Ekta Camp, Pitampura. This initiative aimed to equip residents, particularly youth and women from economically weaker sections, with practical skills to enhance their employability and support their financial independence. The workshop was conducted on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of the NSS 10-days residential camp as part of the Unit's ongoing efforts to uplift underprivileged communities through education and empowerment. The event aimed to teach children and adult residents how to use their creativity and skills to earn additional income. The focus was on making useful and beautiful items from everyday materials, encouraging participants to explore painting, craft-making, and recycling waste into sellable products.

The event featured hands-on sessions and interactive activities to engage participants and maximize learning. The Nitya Foundation team, consisting of trainers and volunteers, provided tools and materials required for the sessions, while the NSS Unit volunteers helped with coordination and participant support. All were engaged in activities such as painting, creating decorative hangings from plates, and transforming waste materials into new and functional items. The volunteers played a crucial role in assisting the residents, demonstrating various techniques, and helping everyone understand how to turn their crafts into potential sources of income. The environment was both educational and fun, with everyone working together to create unique pieces. In addition to skill-building activities, the event included awareness sessions to motivate and guide the participants toward meaningful employment and entrepreneurship.

The event was highly successful, with a large number of participants, both children and adults, actively engaging in the activities. The enthusiasm from the residents and guidance from the volunteers made the event a positive experience for everyone involved. Many of the residents were left with new skills and ideas on how to generate extra income from simple materials, proving that this skill development initiative had a meaningful impact on the community.
