

SESSION OF WASTE SEGREGATION

(UNDER NSS 10-DAYS SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL CAMP)

22nd SEPTEMBER 2024 (SUNDAY)



NSS Unit of GIBS organized a Session on “Waste Segregation” in collaboration with ‘Why Waste Wednesdays’ NGO in our adopted Village Ekta camp on 22nd September 2024. The event took place on 6th day of the 10 days special residential camp held at Ekta camp our adopted village. NSS volunteers conducted interactive sessions, hands-on activities, and demonstrations on waste segregation practices.

The event began with an introduction on the significance of waste segregation, followed by detailed explanations on how to differentiate between types of waste. Volunteers explained the difference between biodegradable, non-biodegradable, and hazardous waste. Residents were informed about the benefits of proper waste segregation, including reduced pollution, improved recycling processes, and minimized health risks associated with improper waste disposal. Volunteers demonstrated simple methods for sorting household waste, such as using color-coded bins (green for biodegradable, blue for recyclables, and red for hazardous waste) and setting up waste segregation areas in their homes. Volunteers conducted a live demonstration, sorting various items into labeled bins. Participants were invited to help with sorting, allowing them to practice their new skills with guidance. Residents were encouraged to make waste segregation a part of their daily routine. Volunteers emphasized the importance of individual and community efforts in maintaining cleanliness and managing waste effectively. They also shared plans for future follow-up visits to monitor the progress of waste segregation practices within the camp.

The event not only left a lasting impression on the students but also contributed to raising awareness about the importance of waste segregation. The NSS unit's initiative at GIBS is set to create a meaningful impact on waste management practices, fostering a cleaner and more sustainable environment for both the local community and beyond.
