

## VISIT TO MEDIATION CENTRE, ROHINI COURT

4<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER 2024 (WEDNESDAY)



Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS) organized a visit to the Mediation Centre at Rohini Court for its 7th-year BA LLB and BBA LLB students on 04.09.2024. This initiative was part of the institution's commitment to providing practical learning experiences that complement academic studies. The visit aimed to offer students a comprehensive understanding of mediation as a crucial component of the legal system and to enhance their knowledge of conflict resolution mechanisms in a real-world context.

The Mediation Centre at Rohini Court serves as a pivotal institution in facilitating amicable dispute resolutions, offering an alternative to traditional courtroom litigation. By arranging this visit, GIBS sought to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application, equipping students with insights into how mediation processes are conducted and their significance in the broader legal framework.

The visit began with a briefing by the mediator in charge. Students were introduced to the concept of mediation, which is a voluntary and confidential process where a neutral third party helps disputing parties to reach a mutually acceptable agreement. The mediator explained how mediation differs from litigation and arbitration, emphasizing its collaborative nature.

Then students were shown around the center, including the mediation rooms, where they observed the setup and environment designed to facilitate open and respectful dialogue. The layout and ambiance were tailored to create a neutral and comfortable space for all parties involved. There students had the opportunity to observe a mediation session in progress. Following the observation, students participated in a question-and-answer session with experienced mediators. They discussed various aspects of mediation, including skills required, challenges faced and real-life applications.

The students found the visit highly informative and expressed interest in pursuing further studies in mediation and ADR. They appreciated the opportunity to witness mediation in a real-world setting, which helped them connect theoretical knowledge with practical application.
