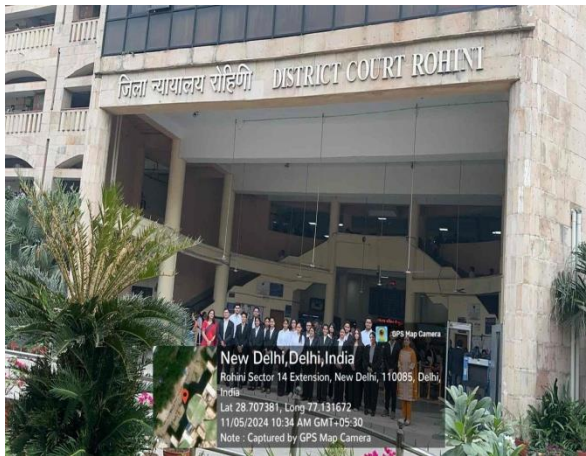


ACADEMIC VISIT TO ROHINI DISTRICT COURT, NEW DELHI 5TH NOVEMBER TUESDAY



An academic visit to the Hon'ble District Court, Rohini, was organized by CLS-GIBS for the students of BBA LLB-1 A & B on 5th November 2024. The visit, which took place from 10:00 A.M. to 1:30 P.M., aimed to provide the students with a comprehensive understanding of the functioning of the court and the responsibilities of judicial officers in the criminal justice system.

The primary objective of the visit was to give students a practical insight into the judicial process, including the role of judges, prosecutors, defense lawyers, and other court officials. Students were able to observe firsthand how cases are handled in court and how the principles of law are applied in real situations. The visit also emphasized the importance of coordination among various stakeholders in the legal system to ensure the effective delivery of justice.

Before entering the courtroom, the students were briefed by the faculty coordinator about the proper decorum and the rules to be followed while inside the courtroom. They were made aware of the solemnity and discipline expected in the court setting. The students then proceeded to Courtroom No. 202, where they witnessed the proceedings of a criminal case under the leadership of Ms. Shefali Sharma, Ld. ASJ-02. The case observed was Hemant Sain vs. Brijesh, providing students with a live demonstration of how the Indian Penal Code (IPC), Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC), and the Evidence Act are applied in practice. The students were able to observe the arguments and counterarguments presented by both the prosecution and the defense, gaining a deeper understanding of the intricacies involved in criminal litigation.

In addition to the courtroom experience, the students were also given an opportunity to interact with various court officials, including judicial officers and staff members. These interactions allowed students to gain valuable insights into the day-to-day responsibilities of legal professionals in the criminal justice system. They were provided with career advice and learned about the challenges faced by practitioners, including the pressure of managing case backlogs and delays in proceedings.


The visit also included a tour of the Mediation Centre at the Rohini District Court, where students were introduced to the concept of alternative dispute resolution. They had the chance to observe live mediation sessions, which involved disputes ranging from family matters to civil and commercial conflicts. The mediators explained the voluntary nature of the process and the role of mediation in resolving disputes amicably, without resorting to prolonged litigation. This session highlighted the importance of mediation in reducing the burden on the judicial system and offering parties an opportunity for a more peaceful resolution of their differences.


The visit provided students with a unique and holistic perspective on the functioning of the criminal justice system. In addition to learning about the legal principles and procedures involved, students gained


a deeper understanding of the practical challenges faced by the courts, such as delays and case backlogs. They also learned about the importance of maintaining discipline and respect in the courtroom and the role of lawyers, judges, and court staff in upholding justice.

In conclusion, the academic visit to the Rohini District Court was an invaluable educational experience for the law students. It not only helped them appreciate the complexities of criminal litigation but also gave them a practical understanding of how legal principles are applied in real-world situations. The exposure to live court proceedings and interaction with legal professionals will undoubtedly enrich the students' academic learning and prepare them for future careers in law.
