#### **PREAMBLE**

The Gitarattan International Business School (giBS) was established in the year 2004 under the aegis of Rohini Educational Society. The Society is proudly running various other successful Institutions in Delhi like Gitarattan Institute of Advanced Studies & Training, Gitarattan Jindal Public School & The Sovereign School. giBS is affiliated to Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi and is approved by All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), Ministry of HRD, Government of India for Technical programmes and Bar Council of India for Law programmes. The Institute is conducting programme like MBA, MBA (International Business), MBA (Integrated), BBA (General), BA LLB (H.), BBA LLB(H.) and LL.M. and

The International Institute of Justice & Police Sciences (IIJPS), at Bengaluru, Karnataka, India, was established as a subsidiary Unit of Lombroso Education and Research Services (OPC) Pvt Ltd (LERS), (with the Corporate Identification Number U80301KA2022OPC163238 and registration number 163238, under the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Government of India) and Appa Education and Research Foundation (a registered Non-Profit Organization under the Ministry of Government of India with CIN number Corporate Affairs, U85300KA2022NPL165152 and registration number 165152) to create trained and educated human resource in the field of Justice, Police, Crime and Security Sciences and bringing innovations in Crime Science through Research, Consultancy, Outreach and Extension services and this MoU between giBS and IIJPS is based on fairness and equality and evidently, each step in the cooperative relationship would be based on mutual consent and consultation.

## I. PURPOSE

The general purpose of this **MoU** is to establish an enduring framework for educational relation and cooperation between the two participating institutions to promote academic learning, training, research, consultancy, outreach, extension and explore the possibility of joint academic programs.

## II. DEFINITIONS

In this Memorandum of Understanding,

- (a) "MoU" means this Memorandum of Understanding.
- (b) "Two Institutions" means the International Institute of Justice and Police Sciences (IIJPS), (Unit of Lombroso Education and Research Services (OPC) Pvt Ltd(LERS) and Appa Education and Research Foundation), Bengaluru, Karnataka and Gitarattan International Business School (giBS) Sector 14, Rohini, Delhi.
- (c) "Confidential Information" means information which by its very nature is confidential or is identified as such by either institution but does not include information which:
- i) may be required to be disclosed by the law of Country; and
- ii) is in the public domain other than by a breach of this MoU.
- (d) "Contact Persons" means an employee of each of the two institutions.

## III. OBJECTIVES

1) To develop Certificate, training programs and workshops jointly and independently in the fields of common interest.

- 2) To participate in organizing conferences, symposiums, colloquiums, roundtable discussions, seminars, training courses, workshops and other similar programs jointly and independently in the fields of common interest.
- 3) To exchange Scholars and Expert Faculties for sharing experience and knowledge.
- 4) To facilitate visits by Trainers and Trainees from each institution to the other.
- 5) To exchange and access academic publication materials, library, computer labs, information, data, other research works related to common interest.
- 6) To share infrastructures and other resources (or cost for the same) required for academic and research purposes.
- 7) Any other areas which come across in future and agreed mutually for common interest.

## IV. SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES

The Scope of Activities intended by the two Institutions under this MoU shall consist of:

- a. Collaborative Executive Education Courses (Executive Certificate Programs,
   Diploma, PG Diploma Online, Offline and Hybrid) and other courses.
- b. Joint Workshop or Joint Workshop Series
- c. Exchange of Knowledge Resources (Faculty, e-resources, etc.)
- d. Collaborative Conference / Seminar Series
- e. Round-Table Discussions

#### V. GENERAL PROVISIONS

The following general provisions will apply for the execution of this MoU:

1. The International Institute of Justice and Police Sciences, (Lombroso Education and Research Services (OPC) Pvt Ltd (LERS), Appa Education and Research Foundation) and Gitarattan International Business School (giBS), shall jointly identify the areas of academic learning, training, research, consultancy, outreach, extension, where mutual cooperation is sought.

- 2. The International Institute of Justice and Police Sciences, (Lombroso Education and Research Services (OPC) Pvt Ltd(LERS), Appa Education and Research Foundation) shall collaborate with the Gitarattan International Business School (giBS) to plan, organize, supervise, discuss any legal program(s) or activities necessary for the achievement of the objectives, and any other such program or activities which may be jointly agreed and/or included in this memorandum of understanding in the nearest future; for mutual benefits of the two institutions.
- 3. The International Institute of Justice and Police Sciences, (Lombroso Education and Research Services (OPC) Pvt. Ltd(LERS), Appa Education and Research Foundation) shall jointly cooperate/collaborate with the Gitarattan International Business School (giBS), to organize academic training/mentorship between Gitarattan International Business School (giBS) Sector 14, Rohini, Delhi and International Institute of Justice and Police Sciences, (IIJPS), and its associate body, South Asian Society of Criminology and Victimology (SASCV).
- 4. Both Institutions shall appoint Nodal Officer(s) who will facilitate the execution of this MoU, by coordinating and communicating relevant information within their respective institutes and arrange consultations for a review of the activities envisaged under this MoU as required. It will be the responsibility of each Institution to inform the other in writing if there is a change in the Nodal Officer(s).
- 5. Both Institutions shall exchange their scholars, experts, faculties, trainers, mentors, interns and mentees as per the programs arranged by either Institution.
- 6. In the event of jointly organized programs, both Institutions shall have to decide mutually about the availability of conveyance, lodging- boarding and other expenses etc. well in advance.
- 7. Both Institutions shall demonstrate synergy of efforts as a team for smooth conduct of courses/programs etc. and ensure direct interface with one another without involving external agencies.
- 8. Both Institutions shall take all reasonable steps to ensure the successful completion of the collaboration and co-operate with each other in duly carrying out the obligations agreed upon.

- 9. All the stakeholders must observe the rules and regulations of the respective institutions.
- 10. The terms of such mutual assistance and cooperation shall be discussed and agreed upon in writing by the appropriate representatives of both parties before the initiation of any program or activity.
- 11. Either Institution shall not be liable for any delays or failure to perform its part, because of any event beyond its reasonable control, including acts of God, fire, floods accidents, terrorism, pandemics, strikes, or riots, and Neither Institution will go for any court cases for any damages nor try to implement any legal actions.
- 12. Implementation of this MOU in part or whole is based on mutual trust and action and nothing as a legal partnership should be construed by both institutions.

## VI. FINANCIAL RELATED PROVISIONS

- 1. Separate Commercial agreement(s)/ MOUs will be signed by both Institutions based on Project(s) or Programs.
- 2. Financial obligations should be discussed beforehand on any Project(s) or Programs and always done in written documents. No Oral discussion on finance will be construed as final until it becomes a written and signed document.
- 3. Joint Programs may lead to both success and failure, financially. Success and Failure of financial components will be mutually shared by both Institutions.

## VII. TERMS OF AGREEMENT OF MOU

- 1) This MoU may be executed in terms of all, or some activities identified.
- 2) This MoU may be amended by mutual consent in writing between the two Institutions and once approved, the amendment shall become a part of the MoU.
- 3) Both Institutions shall maintain confidentiality about any information, course material, plan, discussion, strategy, or any material disclosed under the MoU shall be deemed to be confidential and shall be marked accordingly. Any information, course material, or like in the public domain shall not be part of this commitment.
- 4) Any confidential information received by either institution under this agreement shall be maintained in strict confidence and trust and shall be used for the agreed purpose under this MoU only.

- 5) This MoU is not intended to create legal relations and is not legally binding on the two Institutions or give rise to any financial obligation for both institutions.
- 6) This MoU shall not restrict the rights of the two Institutions in any way in respect of their normal business as individual institutions including any existing or new areas of activity.
- 7) The performance and execution of this MoU shall follow the relevant laws, policies, and requirements of the countries in which the two Institutions are located.
- 8) This MoU will remain in force for an initial period of 3 years until terminated by six months prior written notice given to one Institution by the other Institution. In case a 6 months' notice is served by any institution, any pending works mutually agreed upon should be executed during the notice period without any delay from both institutions.
- 9) IIJPS does not give the exclusive rights to the direct ownership, publication, or outright sale of any intellectual property belonging to IIJPs, or any other business associated therein without the agreement of both parties; and such shall apply to Gitarattan International Business School (giBS), respectively.
- 10) The signing of this Memorandum constitutes a formal undertaking (not a legally binding document), and as such it simply intends that the signatories shall strive to reach, to the best of their abilities, the goals and objectives stated in this MOU.

## VIII. GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTING THE MOU

The following guidelines shall be observed by each of the two Institutions in implementing the MoU:

- (a) Work cooperatively and constructively.
- (b) Consider and promote approaches to achieve positive mutually beneficial outcomes.
- (c) Act in good faith towards each other.
- (d) Communicate openly and honestly with each other.
- (e) Agree in advance, in writing, funding arrangements if any, or use of intellectual property for any activity or program relating to this MoU.
- (f) Prevent unauthorized access to or use of confidential information relating to any activity or program arising from this MoU.

# FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME on "INNOVATIVE TEACHING TECHNIQUES AND LEGAL RESEARCH" $22^{nd}\text{-}\ 29^{th}\ JULY\ 2024$

CLS-GIBS conducted a 7-dayFaculty Development Programme(FDP) on "Innovative Teaching Techniques and Legal Research". This Program mainly focused on Interactive Learning Tools, Problem-Based Learning, Flipped Classroom and Collaborative Learning. By integrating these innovative teaching techniques, legal research education can become more dynamic, practical, and effective.

Day 1: 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2024

## Session 1 - "Dispute Resolution System: Development of ADR and Recent Trends"

Shri Laxmi Kant Gaur, Former Judge defined ADR, its importance and its background that's rooted in various cultures but gained modern prominence in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. He discussed types of ADR:Negotiation which meansdirect discussions between parties to reach a settlement;Mediationthatinvolves a neutral third party facilitating a mutually agreeable resolution;thirdlyArbitrationwhere an arbitrator makes a decision after hearing both sides and fourthly Conciliationwith the conciliator playing a more active role in suggesting solutions.

The speaker also shared knowledge about the recent trends in ADR i.e.

- 1. Online Dispute Resolution (ODR): Use of digital platforms to conduct ADR, accelerated by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. Sector-Specific ADR: Increased use in family law, commercial disputes, and international trade.
- 3. Legislative Developments: New laws and amendments promoting ADR practices.
- 4. Globalization: Growing adoption of ADR in international disputes, supported by bodies like the ICC and UNCITRAL.



At last speaker concluded in his words, "ADR continues to evolve, driven by the need for more efficient, cost-effective, and amicable dispute resolution mechanisms. The integration of technology, globalization, and increasing institutional support are shaping the future of ADR, making it a preferred choice for many individuals and businesses worldwide".




Session 2 - "Exploring Legal Research Methods and Importance of InterdisciplinaryResearch"

Prof. (Dr.) K. Jaishankar, Founder / Principal Director and Professor, IIJPS, Bengaluru, Karnatakahad a great discussion with the faculty members explaining about the Legal Research Methods which included Doctrinal Research that means to analyzes legal texts such as statutes, case law, and legal principles; Empirical Researchthatinvolves collecting and analyzing data through surveys, interviews, and case studies; Comparative Research that compares laws across different jurisdictions or legal systems and lastly, Historical Research, Socio-legal Research and Critical Legal Studies.

He concluded in his words that "Legal research methods are diverse, each offering unique insights and contributions to the understanding of law. Interdisciplinary research enhances these methods by integrating knowledge from various fields, leading to more comprehensive and relevant legal studies. Emphasizing interdisciplinary approaches in legal research will continue to enrich the legal field, fostering innovation and better addressing the complexities of modern society".





Day 2: 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2024

#### Session 1 - "Innovative Research and Challenges of Artificial Intelligence (AI)"

Dr. Neelam Seam, Associate Professor, GIBSpresentedon Innovative Research in AI in Machine Learning (ML) and Deep Learning (DL). She discussed its subfields focusing on the development of algorithms that allow computers to learn from and make predictions based on data, which can implement on an image and speech recognition, natural language processing, predictive analytics and autonomous systems. She focused on the Natural Language Processing (NLP), which Enables machines to understand, interpret, and generate human language, Chatbots, language translation, sentiment analysis, text summarization. Sheexplained the usages i.e. autonomous vehicles, facial recognition, medical image analysis, surveillance systems and in robotics where she explained about the integration of AI with robotics to create intelligent machines capable of performing complex tasks.

She summarized in words that "AI research is driving significant innovations across various fields, leading to transformative applications and capabilities. However, the challenges associated with AI, including ethical concerns, privacy issues, security risks, economic impact, legal and regulatory challenges, and technological limitations, must be addressed to ensure the responsible and beneficial development of AI technologies".





Session 2 - "Legal Research Design"

The next session was taken by Prof. (Dr.) Ravi Kant Gupta, Professor, GIBS. He defined Legal research as systematic investigation of legal questions, analyzing laws, and understanding their application essentially for developing legal arguments, informing policy decisions, and advancing legal scholarship.

He provided an overview of the essential components and frameworks involved in designing legal research. He introduction legal research design, covering fundamental concepts such as research questions, hypotheses, theoretical frameworks, and research objectives. Participants learned about data collection techniques, sampling methods, and the ethical considerations involved in legal research. Prof Gupta informed the participants that Legal Research Design is a detailed design that involves systematic planning and execution of research to answer specific legal questions. It encompasses various methodologies, each suited to different types of legal inquiries.






Day 3: 24th July 2024

## Session 1& 2- "Data Analysis (Qualitative & Quantitative)"

Dr. Chetna Mahaur, Associate Professor, GIBS fore most explained the distinction between qualitative and quantitative data and outlined the steps involved in the data analysis process. She delved into quantitative data analysis, covering statistical methods and tools used to analyze numerical data. Dr Mahaur demonstrated the use of software such as SPSS, R, and Excel for conducting descriptive and inferential statistics. Key topics included hypothesis testing, regression analysis, and data visualization.

The second session focused on qualitative data analysis, exploring methods such as thematic analysis, content analysis, grounded theory, and narrative analysis. Participants learned how to collect and analyze non-numerical data, such as interviews, observations, and textual content. Practical exercises were conducted to demonstrate coding, categorization, and theme development.





Day 4:24<sup>th</sup> July 2024

## Session 1 - "Integrating Practical Skills and Innovative Teaching Methods in Legal Education"

Advocate Bhumesh Verma, International Corporate Lawyer's session aimed to equip students with the competencies required to excel in the legal profession by integrating practical skills and innovative teaching methods. He introduced participants to innovative teaching methods, such as problem-based learning (PBL), flipped classrooms, and experiential learning. He discussed how these methods can make legal education more engaging and effective.

Innovative Teaching Methods like Law Clinics where students handle real cases under supervision secondly, Externships and Internships which includes practical work experiences in law firms, courts, and legal departments and thirdly, Simulations and Role-Playing which means mock trials, moot courts, and negotiation exercises were discussed.






Session 2 – "Bibliography & Citation – Using tools like Mendeley & Zotero"

The next session of FDP was taken by Prof. (Dr.) Abhijit Das, Professor, GIBS, Rohini. This session was mainly aimed to equip participants with the knowledge and skills to use reference management tools for organizing, citing, and sharing research. Prof Das told the importance of bibliographies and citations and why it is important to give credit to original authors and avoid plagiarism. He explained how It allows others to trace the origins of the information, follow up on your research and the knowledge of this domain area specially which contributes to the body of knowledge by connecting the work with existing research.

Prof Das gave anoverview of both software, firstly Mendeley developed by Elsevier and Zotero is an open-source reference management tool developed by the Corporation for Digital Scholarship. Mendeley is a reference manager and academic social network. Features of Mendeley like collaborate the group to sharing; PDF annotation, Web importer& Syncing across devices were the points of discussion. Zotero key features Reference management, Web importer, PDF management, Thousands of citation styles & Cloud sync were also explained.






Day 5: 25<sup>th</sup> July 2024

## Session 1 - "Case Law Methods of Teaching and Case-Based Research"

This online session was taken by Prof.(Dr) Afzal Wani, Pro Vice- Chancellor, IILM University on how law teaching involves using real court cases to illustrate and teach legal principles. Case Law Methos of teaching was given prime importance as students read and analyze judicial opinions to understand the application of law, that are beneficial for them. He also briefly discussed other teaching methods like Socratic Method where instructors ask probing questions about the case to stimulate critical thinking & discussion and Problem-Based Learning (PBL) wherestudents are presented with legal problems derived from real cases and work in groups to resolve them.





Session 2 - "Writing and Publishing Legal Research Paper for High Impact Factor Journals"

Dr. Nidhi Sharma, Associate Professor, GIBS highlighted the role of quality research in contributing to the legal field and the importance of adhering to ethical standards in scholarly work. She focused on the fundamentals of writing legal research papers. She discussed the critical components of a well-structured paper, including the introduction, literature review, methodology, analysis, and conclusion. Emphasis was placed on developing a clear research question, a strong thesis statement, and a coherent argument. Dr Sharma also provided insights into selecting appropriate journals for publication. Her presentation covered the importance of understanding a journal's scope, target audience, and impact factor. Finally, she addressed ethical issues in legal research, including plagiarism, data fabrication, and dual submission. She concluded that by following these steps and adhering to the journal's submission guidelines, you can enhance the likelihood of your paper being accepted and making a significant contribution to legal scholarship.






Day 6: 26th July 2024

## Session 1 - "Legal Ethics and Compliance in Research"

Prof.(Dr.) Ritu Gupta, Professor, NLU, Delhi presented on day 6in an online mode. She sensitized faculty members on the ethical and legal considerations integral to conducting responsible and compliant research. Key topics included the duty of honesty, the avoidance of harm, the protection of confidential information, and the necessity of informed consent. The speaker also discussed the relevance of professional codes of conduct and ethical guidelines established by legal associations and academic institutions. She informed the participants that research involving human subjects must be reviewed and approved by an Institutional Review Board (IRB) to ensure that ethical standards are met. She explained that researchers must disclose any financial or personal interests that could affect their research. The need to conduct regular reviews and audits to ensure ongoing compliance was also given importance.





Session 2 - "Using New Technologies for Teaching"

Prof (Dr). Urvesh Chaudhery, Professor, GIBS presented on Interactive Learning through Multimedia tools like videos and animations. Prof Chaudhery demonstrated how multimedia tools can be used to enhance the teaching and learning experience by making content more accessible, engaging, and interactive. She introduced tools such as videos, podcasts, interactive simulations, digital storytelling, and gamification platforms. The session emphasized the benefits of these tools, including the ability to cater to different learning styles and preferences. She encouraged educators to develop digital literacy skills essential for navigating modern educational technologies.





## Day 7: 29th July 2024

## Session 1 - "Examining the Impact of BNS, BNSS and BSA on Indian Criminal Law"

Prof.(Dr.) Alok Sharma, Professor, Faculty of Law, University of Delhipresented on the three new criminal laws Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), and BharatiyaSakshyaAdhiniyam (BSA) that came into effect from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024, replacing the colonial-era Indian Penal Code (IPC), Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) and Indian Evidence Act. She markedit as a transformation shift in India's approach to substantive criminal law, aiming to simplify and update the legal provisions to reflect current societal values and technological advancements. She discussed the historical context and need for revising the IPC, CrPC, and Evidence Act. She highlighted how the new laws aim to address contemporary issues and align with international standards. The session focused on the practical implications of the BNSS, particularly concerning procedural reforms.




Session 2 - "Review of Literature and Sources of Data Collection"

Prof (Dr). Ravikant Gupta, Professor, GIBS took the last session of the FDP where heexplained about the two types of sources of data collection: Primary Data Sources & Secondary Data Sources. Methods of primary data collection including Surveys/Questionnaires, Interviews, Focus Groups, Observations & Case Studies were discussed. Secondary data sources including Academic Journals and Books, Government Reports and Publications, Organizational Records and Historical Records and Archives



were briefed about. He concluded that the literature review should highlight the importance of the data you intend to collect and how it will contribute to filling gaps in existing research.

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

#### PREAMBLE

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING is entered into by and between the Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS), PSP 2A & 2B, Madhuban Chowk, Rohini, Delhi, India, affiliated to Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New DELHI, India, and SR University, Ananthasagar, Hasanparthy, Hanumakonda 506371, Telangana, India and are referred to collectively as "Parties" or individually as "Party". The parties agree to engage in cooperative programmes of education and research and to promote exchange among their faculty and students, in order to enhance the learning experience, and international understanding, on the basis of equality, mutual benefit and reciprocity; and thereof, the parties wish to define the broad terms and conditions under which they will engage in cooperative programmes.

#### WHEREAS

- A. The parties are interested in working together in connection with the purpose which is described in this memorandum.
- **B.** This memorandum sets out the initial relationship between the parties as well as the respective rights and responsibilities of each party.
- C. Each party respectively is expected to act in good faith in accordance with this memorandum.

## 1. Purpose/Objectives

The goal of this cooperation is to foster academic collaboration, provide opportunities for global experience and to facilitate advancement of knowledge on the basis of reciprocity, mutual benefits and frequent interactions. The parties agree to explore the possibilities of engaging in the following areas of collaboration

- (b) Exchange of students for purposes of education, research, internship, and training.
- (c) Joint organization of seminars, conferences, workshops and short-term continuing education programmes on topics of mutual interest.

(d) Exchange of information on research, teaching, learning materials and other literature relevant to the parties.

## 2. Provisions for collaboration

## 2.1 Faculty-related collaboration

- (a) Each party will be responsible for its own costs related with the administration of the collaborations under this MoU.
- (b) For institution-related collaboration, each party will be responsible for its own costs in connection with all matters relating to collaborations under this MoU. The terms and conditions for each activity, including those concerning stipend, travel, and housing, etc, would be worked out between the parties.

- (c) For faculty-related collaborations, each party will be responsible for its own costs in connection with all matters relating to collaborations under this MoU. As a norm, the travelling cost shall be borne by the home institution, boarding and lodging cost shall be borne by the host institution and the stipend etc shall be worked out mutually by both the parties.



- (d) The terms and conditions for each exchange or assignment, including those concerning stipend, travel, and housing, etc. would be worked out between the parties.
- (e) Any other decision involving financial matter will be taken with the mutual consent of both the parties.

### 4. General Provisions

- (a) Any specific joint projects with legally binding obligations will be set forth in separate written agreements.
- (b) Treatment of intellectual property rights developed through collaborations under this MoU will be determined between the parties through mutual consultation and separate written agreements on a case to case basis. In any case, the support of both the partnering institutions shall be duly acknowledged for all academic products having IPR value.
- (c) All activities conducted under this MoU will be in accordance with the applicable rules and regulations of the home and host institutions, and all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations of the concerned countries.

### 5. Confidentiality

- (a) The parties each hereby acknowledge and agree that in connection with Memorandum, they may have access to information that is confidential and/ or commercially valuable to one or more of the other party (" confidential information"
- (b) For the purpose of this memorandum, confidential information may include but is not limited to:
  - (1) Information of whatever nature relating to the Academic or project to another party whether relating to the academic or project or otherwise.
  - (2) Any information derived from any other information which falls within definition of confidential information and
  - (3) Any copy of any confidential information

Each party agrees that it shall not, at anytime, after executing the activities of this MOU disclose any information in relation to these activities or the affairs of business or method of carrying on the business of the other without consent of both parties.

### 6. Duration, Revision and Termination

(a) The MoU shall become effective on the date that it is signed by both parties and shall be valid for two years.

- (b) The MoU may be revised through the mutual agreement of both the institutions and the approval by the regulatory authority in the concerned country, wherever so required by the law.
- (c) This MoU may be terminated by either party at any time provided that the party who wishes to terminate gives written notice of its intention at least one month prior to the termination. However, ongoing collaborative activities of any kind shall be allowed to conclude irrespective of the termination of this MoU.
- (d) In the event of non- compliance or breach by one of the parties of the obligations binding upon it, the other party may terminate the agreement/ MOU with immediate effect.


### Day1:22<sup>nd</sup> July2024





### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

### Between

Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS), INDIA

And

Tuljaram chaturchand college of Arts, science & commerce (Autonomous), Baramati (M.s.)

### **PREAMBLE**

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING is entered into by and between the Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS), PSP 2A & 2B, Madhuban Chawk, Rohini, Delhi, India, affiliated to Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New DELHI, India, and T. C. College, Baramah (M.S) (Name, Official Address of the University/Institute) affiliated to Savitribai Phule Phne University, Pun(if required) and are referred to collectively as "Parties" or individually as "Party". The parties agree to engage in cooperative programmes of education and research and to promote exchange among their faculty and students, in order to enhance the learning experience, and international understanding, on the basis of equality, mutual benefit and reciprocity; and thereof, the parties wish to define the broad terms and conditions under which they will engage in cooperative programmes.

### 1. Purpose/Objectives

The goal of this cooperation is to foster academic collaboration, provide opportunities for global experience and to facilitate advancement of knowledge on the basis of reciprocity, mutual benefits and frequent interactions. The parties agree to explore the possibilities of engaging in the following areas of collaboration

- (a) Exchange of faculty for limited periods of time for purposes of education, research, training, and consultancy.
- (b) Exchange of students for purposes of education, research, internship, and training.
- (c) Joint organization of seminars, conferences, workshops and short-term continuing education programmes on topics of mutual interest.
- (d) Exchange of information on research, teaching, learning materials and other literature relevant to the parties.
- (e) Share expertise for research publications, educational training, summer courses, diplomas and development programs, and likewise.

### 2. Provisions for collaboration

### 2.1 Faculty-related collaboration

Both the parties to the MoU undertake to promote faculty-related collaboration for academic purposes.

- (a) There may be mobility of the faculty members from one party to the other for short duration on the terms and conditions agreeable to both parties.
- (b) The faculty under mobility may be engaged in teaching programmes, participate in seminars, participate in executive & joint programmes, carry out research work to promote academic interests of both the institutions during the exchange duration.
- (c) The request for exchange of faculty shall be duly forwarded by the interested party and to be agreed by the other party in the terms proposed by the intending party.

### 2.3 Institution-related collaboration

Both the parties to the MoU undertake to promote institution-related collaboration for academic purposes: The parties may mutually decide to undertake institutional-level collaborative activities such as joint conferences/ seminars/ workshops, extramural projects, or other similar activities.

### 3. Costs, Finances, Fees and Insurance

- (a) Each party will be responsible for its own costs related with the administration of the collaborations under this MoU.
- (b) For institution-related collaboration, each party will be responsible for its own costs in connection with all matters relating to collaborations under this MoU. The terms and conditions for each activity, including those concerning stipend, travel, and housing, etc, would be worked out between the parties.
- (c) For faculty-related collaborations, each party will be responsible for its own costs in connection with all matters relating to collaborations under this MoU. As a norm, the travelling cost shall be borne by the home institution, boarding and lodging cost shall be borne by the host institution and the stipend etc shall be worked out mutually by both the parties.

(d) The terms and conditions for each exchange or assignment, including those concerning stipend, travel, and housing, etc. would be worked out between the parties.

### 4. General Provisions




### IIC Webinar on Angel Investment/ venture Capital finding opportunity for early-stage Entrepreneurship

#### 4. Financials:

(GIBS) will provide the adequate infrastructure/ Facilities for conducting meetings/interview sessions with SIMMI INDIA responsible for our students. Not withstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, SF, shall render entire its services under this MoU on pro bono basis i.e. without charging or seeking reimbursement of any payment, fee, charges whatsoever from the Interns or GIBS.



INTI and the University are collectively referred to as the "Parties", and each, a "Party."

Both parties have reached consensus on the following education objectives below:

#### 1. Proposed partnership

Subject to the entry of the definitive agreements, the Parties intend to strengthen the mutual friendly partnership by promoting academic exchanges and exchange of visits by students and faculties of both Parties.

#### a) Student Exchange Programs

#### b) Faculty Exchange Programs

The faculty exchange programs will include, without limitation to, academic visiting & communication in Malaysia program (refer to Appendix 3 for further explanation); online and offline teacher training(refer to Appendix 4 for further explanation); joint operation of seminars, academic meetings and R&D projects; academic funding and visiting scholar program (refer to Appendix 5 for further explanation) and further education programs for bachelor-degree education, master-degree education and doctor-degree education.

#### 2. Term of Partnership

The term for partnership between the Parties shall be five (5) years from the date of this MOU, during which time the Parties may, through friendly discussion, choose the appropriate partnership model and enter into the definitive agreements.

If any Party intends to extend the term, such Party shall send a written notice to the other Party expressing its intent for extension at the end of the fourth (4th) anniversary of the date of this MOU and such renewal shall be prepared in writing and signed by both parties hereto.

#### 3. Exclusiveness

Both parties understand that this MOU is not exclusive and each party is permitted to enter into such agreements as it deems fit with other universities and institutions.

- a) In connection with this MOU, either Party may prepare, compile and distribute materials ("Materials") for use during the discussions. Each Party or its independent contractor(s) authoring such Materials shall retain all ownership right, title and interest (including copyright) in the Materials. Neither Party shall have the right to reproduce, modify or use the Materials of the other Party without the prior written consent in each instance of the other Party or the independent contractor(s) authoring such work.
- b) Subject to mandatory provisions of applicable laws, any intellectual property rights derived from performing this MOU shall be owned by INTI and the use, ownership and licensing of such intellectual property rights shall be governed by INTI's intellectual property policies.
- c) The University will remain the owner of the knowledge, methodologies software and tools that are its own and that it makes available for the execution of this MOU which are not understood in any case to be transferred by virtue of it. Therefore, INTI will refrain from carrying out any conduct that directly implies a violation of intellectual property rights on any material used in the execution of this MOU, whose ownership falls on the University responding to it for any direct damage, immediate and proven that it may cause by the breach of this obligation.

If any Party determines that it is required by taw or regulatory authority or stock exchange to disclose information regarding this MOU or to file this MOU with any regulatory body, it shall, within a reasonable time before making any such disclosure or filing, consult with the other Party regarding such disclosure or filing and seek other Party.



#### WHEREAS:

- C) The Parties intent to cooperate and focus their efforts on cooperation within area of Skill Based Training, Education and Research.
- D) Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing their mutual interest;.
- E) **Proapical Infonet Pvt. Ltd**, the Second Party is engaged in Business, in the fields of *Human Resource Consulting*.
- F) **Proapical Infonet Pvt. Ltd**, the Second Party is promoted by Mohd. Arshi, RZ-2541-A-28 T/F Tugalkabad Extension, New Delhi-110019

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

#### **CLAUSE 1 CO-OPERATION**

1.1 Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the **Institution** and its related wings. #### **CLAUSE 4 VALIDITY**

- 4.1 This Agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period **Proapical Infonet Pvt.**Ltd., the Second Party, as the case may be, will take effective steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of **Proapical Infonet Pvt.**Ltd, the Second Party after termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MOU.
- 4.2 Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 30 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations

#### **CLAUSE 5 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES**

5.1 It is expressly agreed that **First Party** and Second **Party** are acting under this MOU as independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied,

on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party.
