THE PROFESSIONAL EXCELLENCE IN LEGAL PRACTICES
16TH – 20TH DECEMBER 2024

The Winter Legal Development Program is a specialized training initiative designed to significantly enhance the knowledge, skills, and overall capabilities of legal professionals, students, and practitioners across a broad spectrum of legal disciplines. The primary objective of such programs is to focus on recent legislative changes, evolving judicial practices, and the emerging trends within the legal system.

The Winter LDP at GIBS which took place from 16th - 20th December 2024, was a meticulously structured five-day comprehensive program, tailored to provide participants with profound insights into “The Professional Excellence in Legal Practices”. Each day of the event featured a distinguished expert who led a session on a pertinent legal topic, followed by a brief valedictory note to conclude the day's discussions.

Day 1: 16th December 2024

The program kicked off with an engaging session delivered by Prof. Afzal Wani, Pro-Vice Chancellor, IILM University. He focused on the Bhartiya Sakshya Act and explored its far-reaching implications for legal leadership as well as best practices in evidence management. The session aimed to equip participants with practical knowledge on managing and presenting evidence efficiently, ensuring that they could approach legal cases in a manner that is both legally sound and methodically precise. Prof. Wani’s expertise provided participants with an understanding of how evolving legal frameworks impact the way evidence is handled in the courtroom.



Day 2: 17th December 2024

Prof. Dr. Alok Sharma conducted a session on Women's Rights and the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). The discussion centered around the legal protections available to women under the current legal system, particularly in light of recent legislative developments aimed at creating a safer environment for women. Dr. Sharma explored the evolving legal framework and emphasized the importance of strengthening existing protections and expanding the legal safeguards necessary to combat gender-based violence and discrimination.



Day 3: 18th December 2024

The session was led by Sh. Murari Tiwari, Chairman BCD, who addressed the critical issue of Transparency in Action and how ensuring accountability in law enforcement can be enhanced through the provisions of the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNSS). Dr. Deshpande highlighted how the legal system could benefit from greater transparency in law enforcement processes, which, in turn, would foster public trust, improve justice delivery, and mitigate corruption within the system. The session underlined the importance of transparent governance and the role of accountability in building a more equitable legal environment.



Day 4: 19th December 2024

The focus of the program shifted to the pressing issue of Digital Crimes with Dr. Pradeep Rai offering insights on modern solutions to combat cybercrime within the framework of BNSS. Given the increasing incidence of digital crimes and cyber threats, this session addressed the need for legal reforms and the introduction of cutting-edge technologies to combat such challenges effectively. Dr. Rai's session underscored the critical necessity of updating the legal infrastructure to keep pace with the growing complexities of digital crime and the need for modernized tools in law enforcement.



Day 5: 20th December 2024

On the final day, ACP Dinesh Kumar Sharma from Prashant Vihar Police Station conducted a session that explored the practical aspects of the Zero FIR system. This system, which allows the registration of an FIR at any police station regardless of jurisdiction, was explained in detail, highlighting its pivotal role in ensuring that victims of crime have timely access to justice. SHO Khari outlined the procedural steps involved in filing a Zero FIR and explained how this legal provision significantly enhances the efficiency and accessibility of the legal process for individuals who may otherwise face delays due to jurisdictional issues.



In conclusion, the Legal Development Program successfully provided participants with a comprehensive understanding of several contemporary legal challenges.
