

Kumar, Founder of Artography Studio with a brief introduction to Lippan art, including its history and cultural significance, particularly in the Kutch region of Gujarat. Following the introduction, the facilitator provided a step-by-step demonstration on how to prepare the base for Lippan art, create textured patterns using clay, and apply vibrant colours. Participants were encouraged to experiment with their designs while receiving guidance on various techniques, including shaping clay, pressing patterns, and using mirrors for added embellishment. The interactive and hands-on nature of the session fostered a creative environment where participants could express their artistic vision. With art supplies in hand and guided by their mentors, they delved into a realm of



experimentation. These practical exercises not only reinforced classroom teaching but also fostered a sense of confidence and proficiency among the participants.
