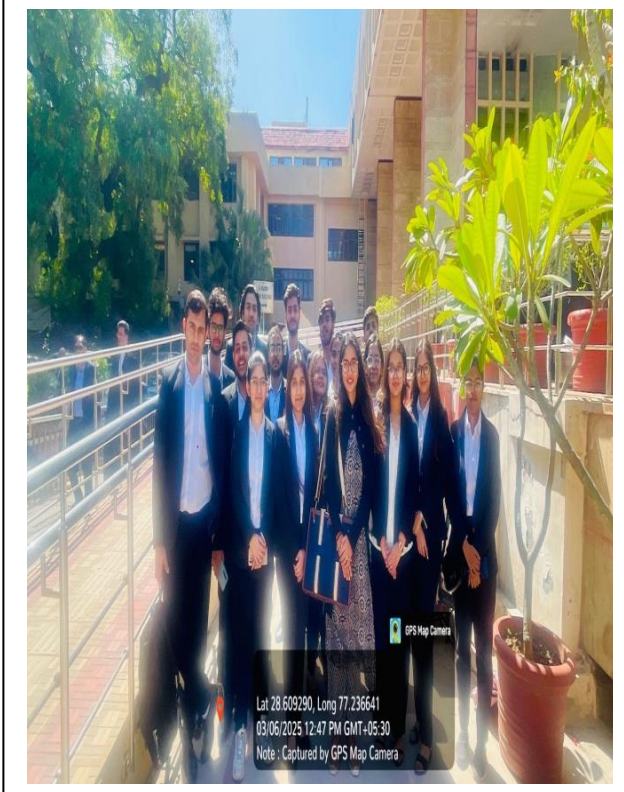


ACADEMIC VISIT TO DELHI HIGH COURT, NEW DELHI 3rd- 7th MARCH 2025 (MONDAY-FRIDAY)




CLS-GIBS conducted an academic visit to the Hon'ble Delhi High Court for the students of BA LLB and BBA LLB 8th Semester from 3rd-7th March 2025 starting from 11:00 A.M. to 1:30 PM. The purpose of the visit was to understand the workings of a court and the nature of the duties of the high court justice system. The visit was to help understand the role of the court in dispensing justice, the role of prosecutors in a case, the way a case proceeds in a court, and the way judges, prosecutors and defense lawyers handle the case. This allowed students to understand the actual need for coordination in the system of justice. The students were instructed by the faculty coordinator about the rules and the decorum to be maintained inside the Court Room. Courtroom No.1, the bench of Chief Justice was presiding and the students witnessed the arguments related to the constitutional matter. It was a wonderful experience for the students to hear these arguments. During the visit, students had the opportunity to engage with court officials, who shared their experiences and insights into the practice of criminal law. This interaction provided valuable career advice and a glimpse into the professional responsibilities of a criminal lawyer.

The visit also highlighted some of the practical challenges faced by the criminal justice system, including case backlogs, delays in proceedings, and the need for timely justice delivery. Along with this, students learned the etiquette to be observed in courts and the discipline to be maintained in the courts. The visit to the Hon'ble Delhi High Court was a highly educational experience for the law students. It offered them a deeper appreciation of the complexities involved in criminal litigation and helped them understand the role of courts in upholding justice. The exposure to real-world legal proceedings will undoubtedly contribute to the student's academic growth and future legal careers.

Several types of cases, including civil, criminal, and constitutional matters, were being heard during the visit, which provided students with a broad view of the legal process. Students were also made aware of the various procedural aspects, such as the role of court clerks and bailiffs, as well as the structure of judgments. Further, they visited the library and found various books written by and about renowned advocates and their experiences in a plethora of cases. Due to security protocols, access to certain sections of the court was restricted, limiting students' exposure to certain aspects of the judicial system.
