

**UNIFORM CIVIL CODE: INTEGRAL IN ACHIEVING
THE CONSTITUTIONAL VISION**
14th FEBRUARY 2025 (FRIDAY)



CLS-GIBS hosted an enlightening guest lecture on the topic “Uniform Civil Code: Integral in Achieving the Constitutional Vision” on 14th February 2025 for Integrated BALLB (H) 2nd semester. Resourceperson Adv. Vishnu Sharma, a distinguished advocate at the Supreme Court of India had insightful discussion on the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) and its role in achieving constitutional principles of equality, justice, and unity in India

Adv. Sharma highlighted the increasing challenges legal systems face due to the evolution of family structures and the need for a cohesive legal framework to address them. He emphasized that the UCC plays a pivotal role in fulfilling the constitutional vision of equality and justice for all citizens, irrespective of their religious backgrounds. He explored Article 44 of the Directive Principles of State Policy, highlighting the constitutional intent behind the UCC. He discussed the impact of the UCC on religious personal laws and its potential to foster gender justice and equality. Landmark judgments such as Shah Bano Case (1985) and Shayara Bano Case (2017) were analyzed to understand the judiciary’s stance on uniform civil laws.

The session concluded with an interactive Q & A session. Adv. Sharma addressed each query with thoughtful responses, offering real-world legal insight. The lecture was a valuable opportunity for students to deepen their understanding of the constitutional vision of equality. The event reinforced the need for an inclusive, consultative approach to framing a UCC that aligns with constitutional values while respecting India’s diverse cultural fabric.

<p>LEARNING OUTCOME</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Participants gained a clear understanding of how the Uniform Civil Code aligns with the constitutional principles of justice, equality, and fraternity. 2. Attendees became aware of how the implementation of a UCC addressed disparities in personal laws and promoted legal equality in areas like marriage, inheritance, and adoption. They learned how this legal framework ensured fairness and equality for all citizens. 3. Participants were encouraged to advocate for a legal system that ensured equal treatment for all citizens, regardless of their religious or cultural backgrounds. They learned the importance of a unified legal framework in promoting national unity and justice. 4. The lecture provided a nuanced understanding of the challenges faced in implementing the UCC, including political,

	religious, and cultural resistance. Students learned about the opportunities for legal reform and social progress, and how these challenges could be addressed in a diverse society.
