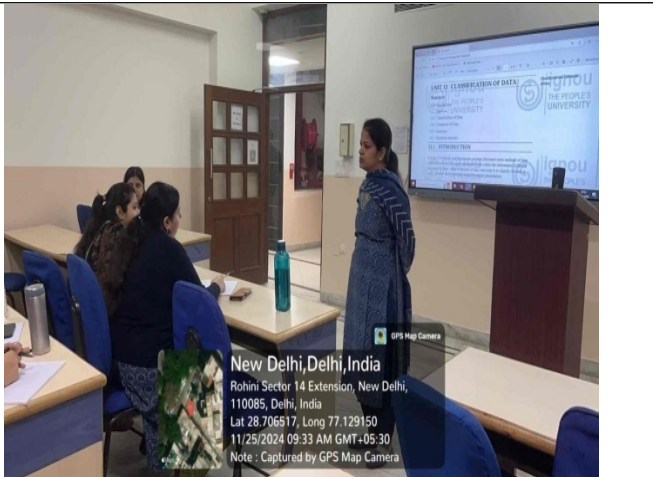


NET QUALIFYING IN HOUSE TRAINING
25TH NOVEMBER 2024 – 25TH DECEMBER 2024



The Institute successfully conducted a **UGC-NET Training Program** for faculty members and students of final year of MBA and LLM who are yet to qualify the **National Eligibility Test (NET)** scheduled by the **University Grants Commission (UGC)** in December 2024. The

initiative was aimed at strengthening the academic qualifications for Competitive Examination of faculty and students for promoting a culture of continuous professional development.

The training was particularly focused on four subject areas — **Law, Commerce, Economics, and Mathematics** — as per the UGC-NET syllabus. It commenced on **25th November 2024** and continued with interactive sessions, mock tests, and resource sharing.

The UGC-NET Training Program was strategically designed to provide comprehensive support through a structured and focused approach. A key highlight of the program was the **syllabus-wise division of topics**, ensuring thorough coverage of each unit as per the UGC-NET curriculum in Law, Commerce, Economics, and Mathematics. This allowed participants to build a strong conceptual foundation in a systematic manner.

To enhance exam readiness, **mock tests and MCQ-based practice sessions** were conducted regularly, enabling participants to simulate real exam conditions and improve their time management and accuracy. These practice sessions helped in identifying strengths and areas requiring improvement. Additionally, **doubt-clearing sessions with expert faculty members** were held after each segment, providing participants with the opportunity to clarify concepts and receive in-depth explanations from subject specialists.

Another significant feature was the distribution of **well-prepared notes and study resources**, which included previous years' question banks, topic-wise summaries, and important reference materials. These resources served as effective revision tools and supported self-study beyond classroom sessions. Throughout the training, a culture of **personalized mentoring and academic support** was maintained, with faculty coordinators addressing individual queries and sharing tailored preparation strategies to maximize the chances of success in the upcoming UGC-NET examination.

The UGC-NET Training Program concluded successfully with enthusiastic participation and positive feedback from the faculty. The sessions were well-received, and the initiative reflects the Institute's proactive approach toward academic upliftment and faculty development. Regular follow-ups and guidance will continue to be provided until the exam.
