

## NDLI SKILL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP "COMPREHENIVE LEGAL DRAFTING SIMULATION ON DOCMASTER"

6<sup>th</sup> OCTOBER 2025 ( MONDAY)











The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Centre for Legal Studies at Gitarattan International Business School organized an NDLI Skill Development Workshop titled "Comprehensive Legal Drafting Simulation on DocMaster" on 6<sup>th</sup> October 2025 for the students of the Integrated B.A. LL.B. and B.B.A. LL.B. Semester IX programs. The workshop aimed to provide practical exposure to legal drafting using the digital platform DocMaster, thereby enhancing students' understanding of the drafting process through simulation-based learning.

The session began with a brief introductory note about the objectives of the workshop and the importance of integrating technology into legal education. The resource person, Ms. Utkarsha Bartwal, Assistant Professor at the Centre for Legal Studies, welcomed the participants and introduced them to the concept of DocMaster, an innovative digital tool designed to assist in the drafting, formatting, and simulation of various legal documents.

The workshop was conducted in two sessions. The first session, held from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., was attended by students of Integrated B.A. LL.B. 9A, while the second session, from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., was conducted for Integrated B.B.A. LL.B. 9A and 9B. During both sessions, Ms. Bartwal provided an in-depth demonstration of DocMaster's interface and



functionalities, explaining how it simplifies the process of legal drafting by offering ready templates, automated formatting tools, and collaboration options. She elaborated on the essentials of legal drafting, such as precision, clarity, structure, and the correct use of legal terminologies.

Students were given practical exposure through live simulation exercises where they drafted legal documents like contracts, agreements, affidavits, and petitions under her supervision. They learned to identify the essential components of a draft, frame clauses effectively, and ensure logical coherence in their documents. The resource person also emphasized the significance of adhering to statutory formats and maintaining professionalism in language and tone. Interactive discussions were held throughout the session, encouraging students to clarify doubts related to legal drafting, formatting, and the application of digital tools in real legal scenarios.

The workshop further highlighted how digitalization is transforming legal practice and how platforms like DocMaster can significantly enhance efficiency and accuracy in drafting. Students were also made aware of the ethical aspects of legal documentation and the need to ensure confidentiality and data integrity while using online drafting tools. The session concluded with a live demonstration of saving, reviewing, and sharing digital drafts within the platform. The enthusiasm and active participation of students reflected their keen interest in adopting digital drafting practices. The workshop ended with a short feedback interaction, where students expressed that the hands-on experience and practical exposure were extremely valuable and relevant to their academic and professional growth.
