THE 5TH ANNUAL LEX FIESTA OF CLS, GIBS

8TH – 11TH OCTOBER 2025



On 8th October 2025, the Court Room Society of the Centre for Legal Studies, Gitarattan International Business School, successfully hosted its 5th Annual Lex Fiesta – Justitia 5.0. The event brochure was released prior to the competitions, and students from universities across the country participated enthusiastically, creating a highly competitive and vibrant atmosphere. The ceremony celebrated the convergence of legal scholarship, professional skill

development, and cultural exchange, bringing together distinguished guests, esteemed faculty members, and an energetic gathering of students from diverse institutions.

The program commenced with a warm welcome to the dignitaries, including the Chief Guest, Hon'ble Justice Mr. N. Kotiswar Singh, Supreme Court of India, and the Guest of Honour, Senior Prof. (Dr.) V. K. Ahuja, Director, Indian Law Institute. The inaugural session began with the lighting of the ceremonial lamp symbolizing the enlightenment of knowledge and the pursuit of justice accompanied by a melodious invocation that set an inspiring tone for the event.

The inaugural ceremony also provided an overview of the key events planned for the fest, which included Resolva Con (Mediation), Clash of Minds (Debate), TheForensics Fanatics (Crime Scene Investigation), The Parliament Pulse (Youth Parliament), Client Connect (Client Counselling), Legal Divine (Law Olympiad), and the much-anticipated 8th Moot Court Competition.

After Inauguration, Preliminary rounds of Meditation Competition started with total 12 teams from all over India. The competition was divided in Preliminary, Semi-final and Final. Draw of lots was done before the competition online platform. On the day of the event the judges of preliminary and semifinal were given a briefing of the competition structure, rules, and evaluation criteria. Adv Raghvendra Kumar, Adv Manoj Kohli, Dr. Ashwini Siwal & Dr. Anu Mehra were the judges of the semi-finals.



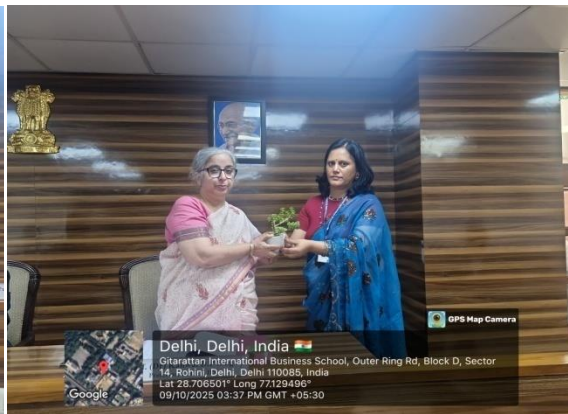
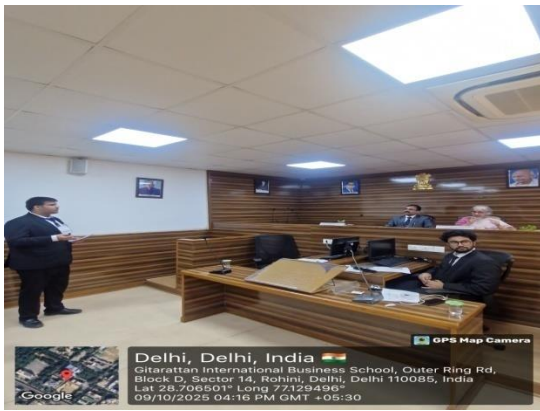

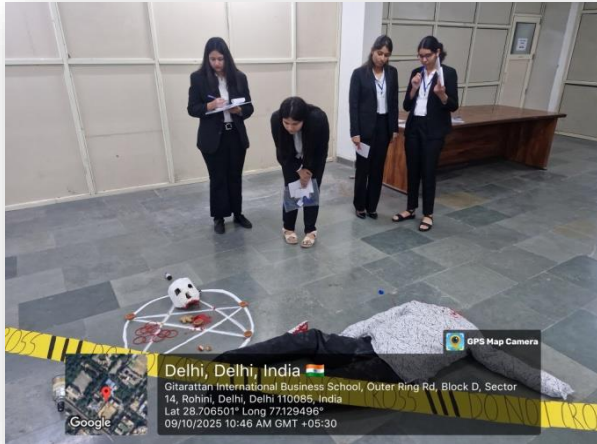


On the 2nd Day i.e. 9th October 2025, the day started with the registration of Law Debate Competition for the Law students. This year's event focused on the pressing topic of *“One Nation, One Election: Democratic Efficiency, Federal Erosion, or Political Centralisation?”* which sparked vibrant discussions among participating students. The event saw enthusiastic participation from students from different colleges who presented their fierce views and debating skills over the provided topic. Total 16 teams participated from all over India. The competition was divided into Preliminary, Semi-final and Final. The judges for final round were Advocate Dr. Vinod

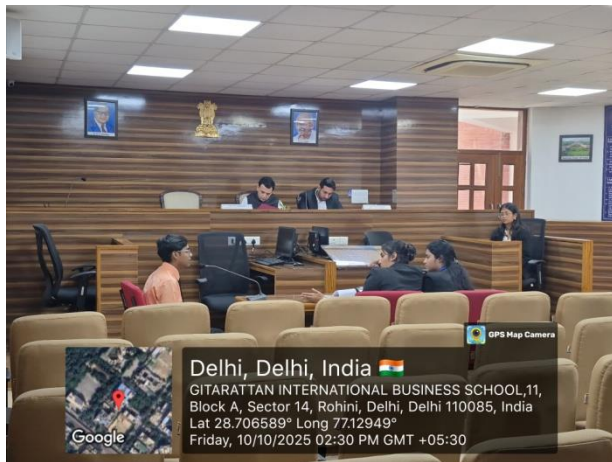
Kumar Goyal & Prof. (Dr.) Kanwal D.P.Singh. Lloyd Law College emerged as winners, Lingaya's Vidyapeeth University held the runners up position. Christ University was held the Best Speaker 'For the Motion' & Delhi University given the Best Speaker 'Against the Motion'.



Simultaneously on 9th October 2025, Crime Scene Investigation competition was organized. The event, held over one day, brought together over 20 teams from prestigious law colleges and universities across India. The judges for final round were Forensic Examiner Dr. Suminder Kaur from Forensic Laboratory, Delhi (FSL) and Retired District and Session Judge, Delhi Hon'ble T.R. Naval. Lingaya's Vidyapeeth University emerged as winner and KCC Institute of Legal and Higher Education secured the runner-up position. The competitions focused on assessing participants' ability to work together, effectively manage conflicts and find creative solutions. Their outstanding investigative skills and teamwork led them to successfully solve the simulated crime scene, showcasing their analytical and problem-solving abilities.



On the 3rd Day, i.e. 10th October 2025, the day started with registration of Client Counselling with and it witnessed participation from 19 teams. . Each team consists of two students as Counsel 1 and Counsel 2. There was one student from the event coordinators who portrayed the role of client for the participating teams. Majorly, the participating students were from 2nd and 3rd year. The Panel of 2 judges was present for the Final Round, Adv. R. S. Goswami & Adv. Vivek Shookan. National Law University, Sonapat emerged as winner of Client Counselling Competition.



On 10th October 2025, Law Olympiad was organized Virtually, The virtual event, held over one day, brought together over 100 participants from prestigious law colleges and universities across India. The event featured a comprehensive quiz comprising 100 questions designed to test participants on diverse areas of law, including constitutional, criminal, general studies and international law. After a brief introduction and overview of the rules, participants were given a set time to complete the quiz. The atmosphere was charged with excitement as students focused intently, demonstrating their legal acumen and quick thinking.



On 3rd and 4th Day of Justitia 2025 i.e. 10th& 11th November 2025, Youth Parliament was held. This year's event focused on the pressing topic of the “Income Tax Bill, 2025 and the Question of Privacy” which sparked vibrant discussions among participating students. The event saw enthusiastic participation from students who took on various significant portfolios, embodying notable personalities, including Shri Narendra Modi, Shri Antony, Dr. C.N Manjunath, Smt. Geeta Kora, Amit Shah, Kiren Rijiju, Rahul Gandhi, Rajesh Ranjan, Ms. S. Jothi Mani etc. Each student effectively represented their assigned figure, contributing unique perspectives and engaging in robust debates surrounding the implications of the One nation, One vote on society. The discussions were marked by high energy, as students articulated their views and engaged with opposing arguments.



In continuation to Justitia, the 8th National Moot Court Competition was organized on 22nd November 2025 with the objective of providing law students from across the country an opportunity to showcase their advocacy skills, legal understanding, and courtroom etiquette. The competition commenced with the Preliminary Rounds via Online Mode held on 15th November 2025, witnessing enthusiastic participation from teams representing various law colleges and universities from all over India. The teams displayed remarkable preparation and confidence as they argued complex legal issues before panels of experienced judges.

The Semi-Final and Final rounds were conducted on 15th & 22nd November 2025 respectively, where the shortlisted teams were Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Delhi Institute of Rural Development, Tanta University, Rajasthan and USLLS University School of Law and Legal Studies, IPU. They competed with exceptional zeal and intellectual rigor. Arguments presented in these advanced rounds demonstrated in-depth research, sophisticated legal reasoning, and strong command over facts and precedents. The judging panel, comprising Adv. Vineet N Goyal, Adv. KK Sharma, Adv. Shekhar Gupta and Prof. Sushmita Mallya, Delhi University, further enriched the competition by offering constructive feedback on advocacy, research methodology, and courtroom conduct. After tough competition, USLLS University School of Law and Legal Studies, IPU and Delhi Institute of Rural Development were the finalist and the competition was won by Institute of Rural Development. The judging panel were Retd. Justice. Shalinder Kaur, Delhi High Court, Retd. Justice Mohan Mehta, Delhi High Court and Retd. Justice P.K. Dham, Delhi High Court.



The valedictory ceremony commenced with a warm welcome to all attendees, Winners and runners-up from each competition and Chief Guest of the Event i.e. Hon'ble Justice Dr. Anil Agarwal, IAS Special Secretary Home and Principal Director, FSL Forensic Science Laboratory Home Department, Govt. of NCT of Delhi & Guest of Honour Prof. (Dr.) Devinder Singh (Vice Chancellor, DBRANLU) who honored the Winners with a range of rewards, including cash prizes, certificates, trophies, and internship opportunities. These accolades not only celebrated their achievements but also provided tangible incentives to continue striving for excellence in their legal careers. The variety of competitions ensured that participants had the opportunity to showcase their talents in multiple domains, from legal reasoning and advocacy to negotiation and public speaking.
