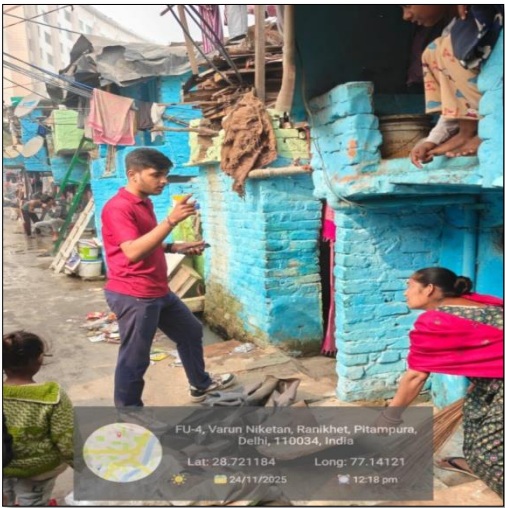


10 DAYS SPECIAL CAMP -DAY 5
SKILL DEVELOPMENT
24TH NOVEMBER 2025 (MONDAY)



The NSS Unit of Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS) conducted a **Skill Development Awareness Drive** on Day 5 of the 10 Days Camp at Ekta Camp, Rohini. The event was organized with the objective of empowering community members—especially women—by informing them about accessible skill training opportunities that can help them achieve financial independence.

In collaboration with **EduQuest Foundation**, the volunteers visited households across Ekta Camp to spread awareness about various skill development programs available in and around the area. The volunteers explained the importance of learning vocational skills and how these skills could support self-sustainability and income generation.

Residents were informed about government portals and websites offering free or low-cost online skill development courses, enabling them to learn from home at their convenience. Additionally, the team highlighted the Skill Development Centres run by EduQuest, located at multiple accessible locations. These centres offer practical training in useful skills such as:

- Parlour & Beauty Services
- Tailoring & Stitching
- Basic and Advanced Computer Skills

The volunteers also informed residents that these courses are available at very minimal charges, starting as low as ₹50–₹100, making them accessible even for low-income households.

The awareness drive received positive responses, with many women showing interest in enrolling for skill training programs to support their families and enhance their personal capabilities.
