



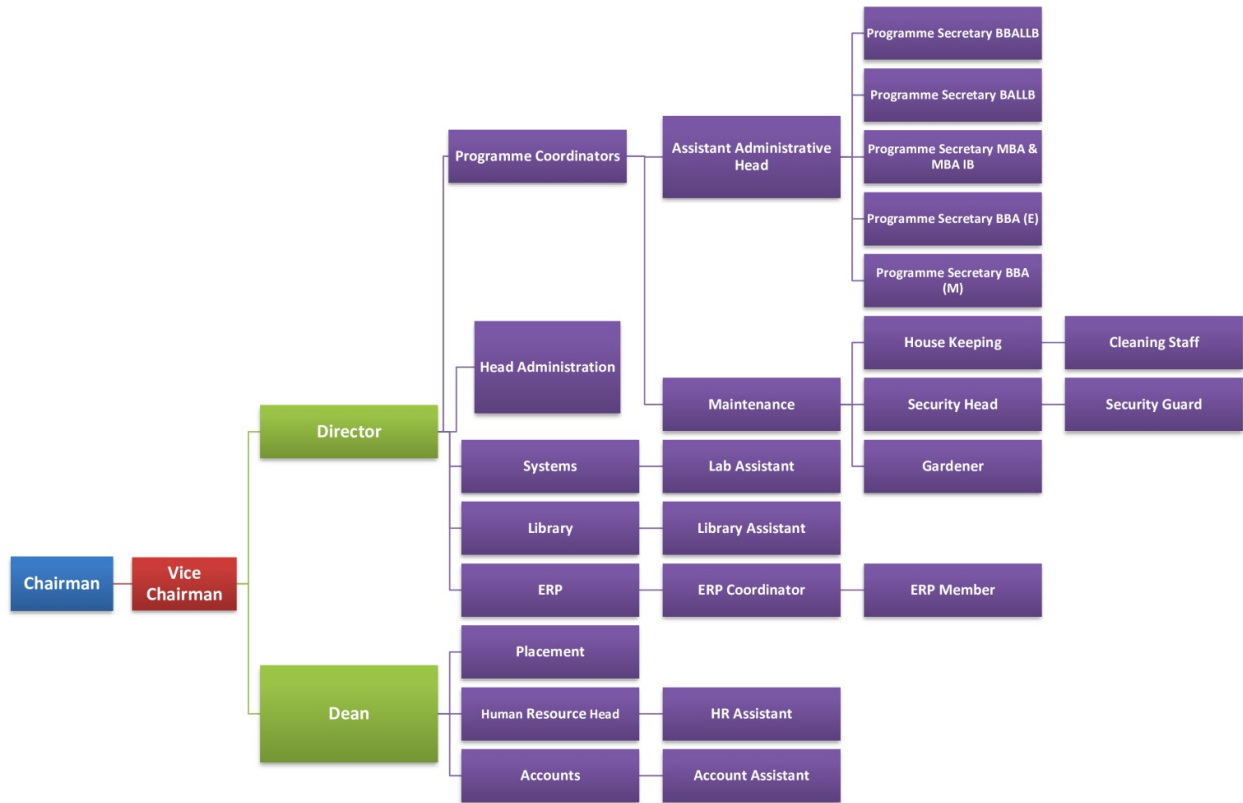

GOVERNANCE, PARTICIPATION, GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL, ANTI-RAGGING AND QUALITY ASSURANCE

1. Nature and Extent of Involvement of Faculty and Students in Academic Affairs and Institutional Improvements


The Institute promotes participative governance and a collaborative academic environment in which faculty members and students actively contribute to academic planning, institutional development, quality enhancement, and decision-making processes.

A. Academic Leadership and Execution

Under the academic leadership of the Director, Principal (Law), and Dean (Corporate Affairs), the Programme Coordinators ensure the effective implementation of academic, co-curricular, and institutional activities. Faculty members actively participate in planning, execution, monitoring, and review of these activities through a structured and coordinated academic framework.

B. Functional Committees and Participative Governance

The Institute functions through duly constituted statutory, academic, co-curricular, extra-curricular, and administrative committees. Faculty members are entrusted with specific responsibilities in accordance with their expertise, experience, and insti

Students are also associated, wherever applicable, through representation and participation in institutional processes. This promotes decentralized decision-making and participative management.

C. Student Representation in Academic Processes

Students play a proactive role in institutional functioning through:

- representation in various functional committees;
- the Class Representative–Faculty Coordinator mechanism;
- active participation in academic, co-curricular, outreach, and institutional events; and
- regular interaction with faculty mentors, Programme Coordinators, and institutional authorities.

This system strengthens transparency, communication, accountability, and student engagement in academic matters.

D. Feedback-Driven Continuous Improvement

The Institute follows a structured feedback mechanism involving students, faculty, alumni, employers, and other stakeholders. Feedback is systematically collected, analysed, and reviewed at the appropriate academic and administrative levels. Based on such analysis, corrective and preventive measures are undertaken to ensure continuous improvement in teaching-learning processes and institutional practices.

E. Mentor–Mentee System

The Institute has a well-established Mentor–Mentee Scheme through which faculty mentors provide:

J. Innovation and Entrepreneurship Ecosystem

2. Mechanism / Norms and Procedure for Democratic and Good Governance


B. Participatory Governance and Decentralization

Committee heads and members are assigned roles based on competence, interest, experience, and institutional requirements. Rotation of responsibilities promotes leadership development and prevents stagnation.

C. Strategic Planning and Resource Optimization

The Institution undertakes structured planning for academic development, infrastructure utilization, research promotion, innovation, and student support. Institutional planning focuses on:

- optimum utilization of physical infrastructure and learning resources;
- effective deployment of human and intellectual resources;

E. Student Participation and Leadership Development


Students are encouraged to participate actively in governance and institutional development through:

3. Student Feedback on Institutional Governance and Faculty Performance

The Institution has a structured Feedback Handling Policy aimed at academic and administrative improvement.

- Feedback is collected periodically through online mode / ERP.
- Feedback covers course-related aspects, faculty performance, academic delivery, institutional processes, and governance-related parameters, as applicable.
- Alumni feedback and employer feedback are also obtained to assess programme relevance and institutional effectiveness.
- The feedback is analysed at the Programme Level / appropriate academic level and submitted to IQAC / competent authority for review.
- Based on such analysis, corrective measures and improvement actions are undertaken.
- Action Taken Reports are prepared and reviewed through the institutional quality assurance mechanism.

This structured feedback process ensures transparency, accountability, and continuous quality enhancement.

4. Grievance Redressal Mechanism for Faculty, Staff and Students

A. Student Grievance Redressal

All grievances are duly recorded, reviewed at the appropriate level, and resolved in a time-bound manner. The complainant is informed about the outcome of the grievance, and records are maintained for monitoring and compliance purposes.

B. Grievance Redressal for Faculty and Staff

The Institution also provides a formal grievance redressal mechanism for faculty and staff members for matters relating to service, administration, work environment

functioning. Such grievances are examined by the appropriate institutional authority / committee in accordance with institutional norms.

C. Institutional Monitoring

The grievance redressal mechanism is monitored through periodic meetings, maintenance of records, and review of Action Taken Reports to ensure fairness, transparency, and continuous improvement.

D. Escalation to University-Level Mechanism

Where applicable, unresolved student grievances may be escalated to the University-level grievance redressal mechanism / Ombudsperson of the affiliating university in accordance with applicable norms and procedures.

5. Anti-Ragging Mechanism and Preventive Measures

The Institution maintains a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging and is committed to providing a safe, secure, and disciplined campus environment.

A. Constitution of Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squad

The Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squad are duly constituted and functional within the Institute. The details of the Nodal Officer, Committee Members, and Squad Members are displayed on the Institute website and notice boards.

B. Awareness and Dissemination

The anti-ragging policy, consequences of ragging, complaint procedures, and helpline details are communicated to students through:

C. Complaint and Reporting Mechanism

The Institution provides multiple channels for reporting ragging-related incidents, including:

- in-person reporting to designated authorities;
- complaint / suggestion box;
- online reporting through ERP / website;
- dedicated email mechanism; and
- direct reporting to the Anti-Ragging Committee / Squad.

- vigilance by the Anti-Ragging Squad;
- CCTV surveillance, wherever installed; and
- strengthened security and preventive supervision.

E. Prompt Action and Disciplinary Measures

All reported incidents are promptly examined and appropriate action is taken against any person found involved in ragging, in accordance with applicable institutional rules and statutory provisions.

F. Counselling and Support Services

The Institution extends counselling and support to affected students and undertakes awareness initiatives to promote mutual respect, responsible behaviour, and a ragging-free campus environment.

G. Undertaking by Students and Parents

At the time of admission, students and parents are required to submit anti-ragging undertakings in the prescribed format as part of the admission process.

6. Process for Handling Complaints Related to Ragging

The Institution follows a structured, fair, and transparent mechanism for handling complaints related to ragging.

A. Receipt of Complaint

Upon receipt of information or complaint regarding ragging, the matter is immediately brought to the notice of the designated authority / Anti-Ragging Committee.

B. Preliminary Inquiry

A preliminary inquiry is conducted promptly to ascertain the basic facts of the matter. Statements of concerned persons and available evidence are examined as part of the initial assessment.

C. Reporting to Competent Authority

The findings of the preliminary inquiry are placed before the competent institutional authority for further action.

D. Disciplinary and Preventive Action

Based on the facts and findings, appropriate disciplinary, corrective, and preventive measures are initiated in accordance with institutional rules and applicable statutory provisions.

7. Establishment of Online Grievance Redressal Mechanism

The Institution has implemented an Online Grievance Redressal Mechanism to ensure accessibility, transparency, confidentiality, and efficiency in addressing student concerns.

A. Digital Submission of Grievances

Students may submit grievances remotely through the ERP portal / institutional online mechanism from any location.

B. Status Tracking and Communication

The mechanism enables tracking of grievance status, and responses / final decisions are communicated to the concerned student through the institutional platform / official communication channel.

C. Confidentiality and Accountability

The online grievance system supports confidentiality, proper record maintenance, accountability, and timely redressal of complaints.

D. University-Level Grievance Redressal

The affiliating university has also established a University-level Grievance Redressal mechanism / Ombudsperson for resolution of matters that remain unresolved at the institutional level, in accordance with applicable regulations.

8. Establishment of Internal Committee (IC) / Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

The Institution has constituted an Internal Committee (IC), also referred to as the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), to ensure a safe, secure, and gender-sensitive campus environment.

C. Meetings and Documentation


The Committee conducts meetings from time to time to review student issues, support measures, and institutional compliance requirements. Proceedings and resolutions are recorded and maintained appropriately.

17. Best practices adopted, if any.

Best Practice 1 :Enhancing Teaching Quality through Peer Mirroring

Peer Mirroring is an innovative academic practice adopted by the institution to improve the quality and effectiveness of teaching. The practice involves classroom observation by peer faculty members who provide constructive and non-hierarchical feedback to instructors. Before the session, the instructor shares the course details, learning objectives, and session plan with the observer. During the lecture, the observer evaluates aspects such as instructional strategies, student engagement, communication effectiveness, use of teaching resources, and achievement of course outcomes.

After the observation, a reflective meeting is conducted where the instructor and observer discuss strengths, areas for improvement, and strategies for enhancing classroom delivery. The observer also submits a brief report to the Director for academic review and development purposes.

The implementation of peer mirroring has resulted in significant improvements in teaching methodologies, student engagement, and classroom interaction. Student feedback and course evaluations have shown higher satisfaction levels and improved attendance in several courses. Faculty members have also benefited through professional collaboration, shared learning, and increased confidence in their teaching practices.

Overall, peer mirroring has created a supportive academic environment that promotes continuous faculty development and contributes to better learning outcomes for students.

Best Practice - 2: Corporality (Personality and Skill Development Initiative)

Corporality reflects the institute's commitment to holistic student development by focusing on personality development, skill enhancement, and knowledge enrichment. As a finishing school, the institution organizes seminars, workshops, and training programs to prepare students for the corporate world and enhance their employability.

The main objective of this practice is to sensitize students to corporate realities, develop soft skills, analytical abilities, and professional competencies, and build confidence and self-esteem among students. Through structured training interventions, the institute aims to equip students with industry-relevant knowledge and skills required for successful careers.

To implement this initiative, the institute conducts several lecture series and training programs throughout the academic year. These include the **Eminent Lecture Series (ELS)** featuring industry leaders and professionals, the **Professional Lecture Series (PLS)** focusing on industry expectations from fresh graduates, and the **Alumni Lecture Series (ALS)** where alumni share their professional experiences. In addition, **Skill Based Training (SBT)** programs are conducted in alignment with the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020** to enhance practical skills and employability.

This practice has significantly contributed to improving students' employability and entrepreneurial orientation. Increased placements and a growing interest among students indicate the success of the initiative. However, challenge: finding suitable industry experts and organizing industry visits and internships are sometimes encountered. These challenges are addressed through continuous collaboration with industry professionals, alumni, and institutional partners.

a) INSTITUTE INNOVATION CELL

IIC Establishment and Framework

The Institute Innovation Cell (IIC) at GIBS was established in 2021 to align with the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell initiative. The IIC operates with a clear vision to create an enabling entrepreneurial environment for innovation and startups, supported by a mission focused on strengthening the entrepreneurial ecosystem, collaborating with incubation centers, promoting entrepreneurship, creating seed capital, and establishing dedicated innovation spaces.

Leadership Structure

The IIC is led by President Mr. Anirudh Jindal (Vice-Chairman, GIBS) and Vice President Prof. Dr. Vikas Nath (Director, GIBS), with Prof. Urvesh Chaudhery serving as Convener and ARIIA Coordinator. The council comprises 13 faculty members with specific roles including innovation, startup, IPR, internship, and social media coordination.

The Institute Innovation Council (IIC) of Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS) actively promoted a culture of innovation, entrepreneurship, and intellectual property awareness during the academic year 2024–25. Established in alignment with the Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell, the IIC aims to develop an entrepreneurial ecosystem and encourage students and faculty to engage in innovation-driven activities.

During the year (2024-25), the IIC organized **23 activities as per the IIC calendar and 33 self-driven activities**, including workshops, seminars, competitions, and mentoring sessions on entrepreneurship, digital marketing, design thinking, intellectual property rights, and startup funding. These initiatives saw participation from **934 students, 50 faculty members, and 250 external participants**, reflecting strong engagement with innovation and entrepreneurship programs.


The institution has established a **pre-incubation facility with computing infrastructure**, mentorship support, and collaboration with incubation centers such as the Atal Innovation Centre at GGSIP University. The council consists of **35 members including faculty and students**, supported by **31 Innovation Ambassadors** who actively promote innovation and startup awareness.

Significant achievements include **9 Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) filings, 10 innovative ideas submitted on the IIC portal under the YUKTI Innovation Challenge, and 5 student startups** initiated during the year. The institute also organized entrepreneurship competitions, management fests, and mentoring sessions to support idea generation and startup development.

Through these initiatives, GIBS continues to strengthen its innovation ecosystem by encouraging creativity, industry collaboration, and entrepreneurial thinking among students and faculty members.

Financial Investment: Rs. 3,08,280 spent on promoting innovation and entrepreneurship awareness; Rs. 2,08,400 grants/funds supported student and faculty innovations




