

VISIT TO HIGH COURT
10TH FEBRUARY – 13TH FEBRUARY 2025
(TUESDAY- FRIDAY)



Gitarattan International Business School successfully organized an academic visit for the students of Integrated B.A. LL.B. (4A & 4B), 4th Semester, to the Hon'ble Delhi High Court from 10th to 13th February 2026. The visit commenced at 11:00 A.M. onwards. The primary objective of the visit was to provide practical exposure to students regarding the functioning of the High Court and to enhance their understanding of the judicial system.

This exposure helped students appreciate the coordination required within the justice delivery system. Prior to entering the courtroom, the faculty coordinator briefed the students about the rules, security protocols, and decorum to be maintained inside the court premises.

The students visited Courtroom No. 1, where the Bench of the Hon'ble Chief Justice was presiding. They witnessed arguments related to a constitutional matter, which was a remarkable and enlightening experience. Observing live court proceedings allowed students to gain insight into courtroom advocacy, judicial reasoning, and procedural conduct.

During the visit, several types of cases, including civil, criminal, and commercial matters were being heard. This provided students with a comprehensive understanding of the diverse nature of legal proceedings in the High Court.

Students were also made aware of various procedural aspects such as:

- The role of court clerks and bailiffs
- The structure and delivery of judgments
- Courtroom discipline and formal etiquette

The students had the opportunity to interact with court officials, who shared their professional experiences and insights into the practice of criminal law. These interactions provided valuable career guidance and offered a glimpse into the professional responsibilities and ethical standards expected of a criminal lawyer. The visit also highlighted practical challenges faced by the criminal justice system, including case backlogs, delays in proceedings and urgent need for timely justice delivery.

Through this experience, students developed a deeper appreciation for the complexities involved in criminal litigation and judicial administration. Students visited the High Court library, where they explored a wide range of legal books written by and about renowned advocates and their experiences in numerous significant cases. This further enriched their academic understanding of law and legal practice.

However, due to strict security protocols, access to certain sections of the court was restricted, which limited exposure to some administrative aspects of the judicial system.

The academic visit to the Hon'ble Delhi High Court was a highly educational and enriching experience for the law students. It provided them with practical exposure to real-world legal proceedings and enhanced their understanding of the functioning of the judiciary. The visit significantly contributed to their academic development and will undoubtedly support their future legal careers by strengthening their knowledge of court procedures and the role of courts in upholding justice.
