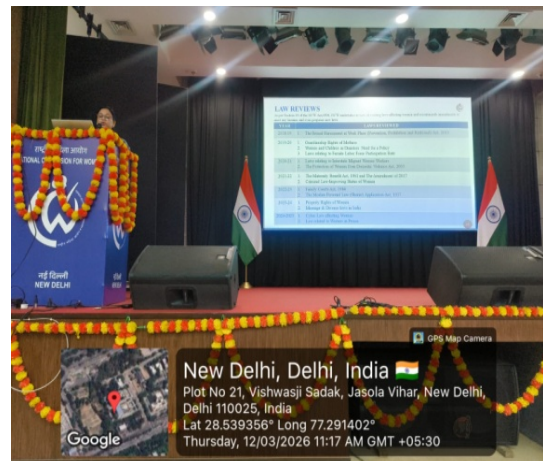


## VISIT TO NATIONAL COMMISSION FOR WOMEN

12<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2026 (THURSDAY)



Gitarattan International Business School organized an educational visit for the BA LL.B. 8th Semester students to the National Commission for Women (NCW) on 12th March 2026 at its office in Jasola, New Delhi. The visit was coordinated by Ms. Sakshi Solanki and Ms. Ankita Dubey, with the objective of providing students practical exposure to the functioning of a statutory body dedicated to women's rights and empowerment.

Upon arrival at the NCW office, the students and faculty members were warmly received. The visit commenced with an informative presentation session conducted by Ms. Shivani. In her presentation, she elaborated on the structure, roles, and functioning of the National Commission for Women. She highlighted various initiatives and schemes undertaken by NCW for the protection, empowerment, and welfare of women across the country. The session also emphasized the Commission's role in addressing grievances, conducting inquiries, and contributing to policy advocacy.

The presentation reflected on:

- The institutional framework and functioning of the National Commission for Women.
- Various initiatives and programs undertaken by NCW for women empowerment and protection.
- The mechanism for addressing complaints and ensuring justice for women.
- The role of NCW in spreading legal awareness and promoting gender equality.
