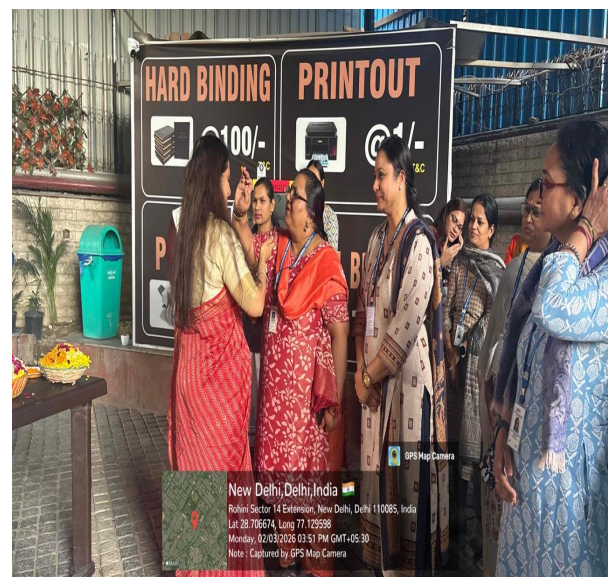
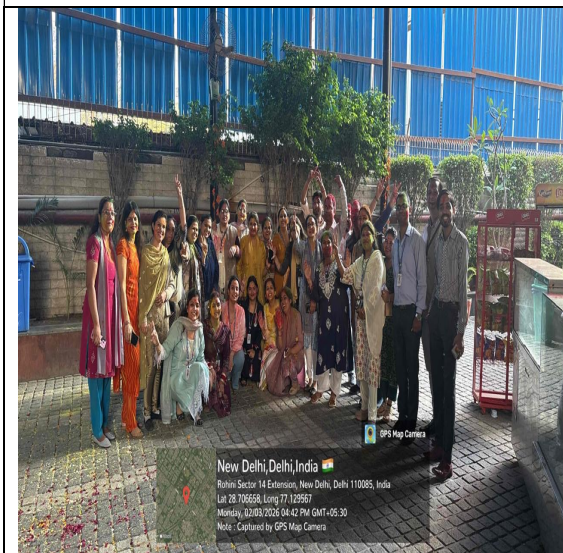
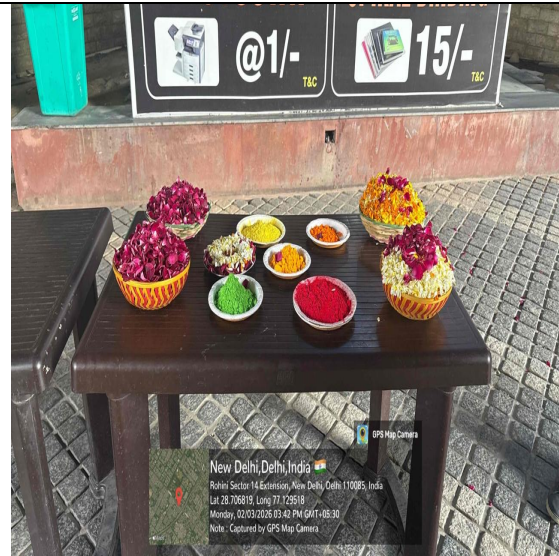
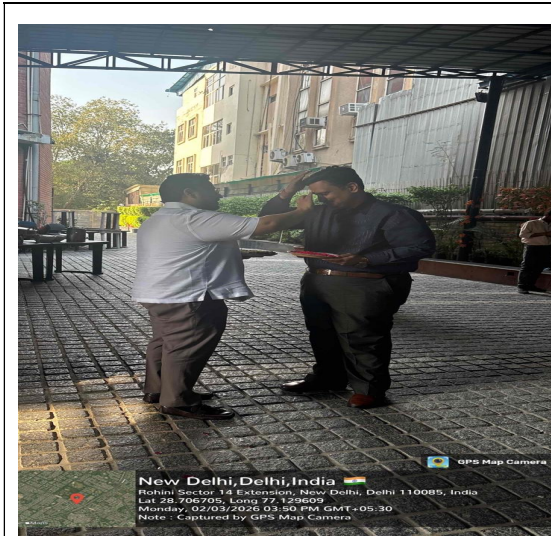


HOLI CELEBRATION
