27TH MARCH 2026 (FRIDAY)



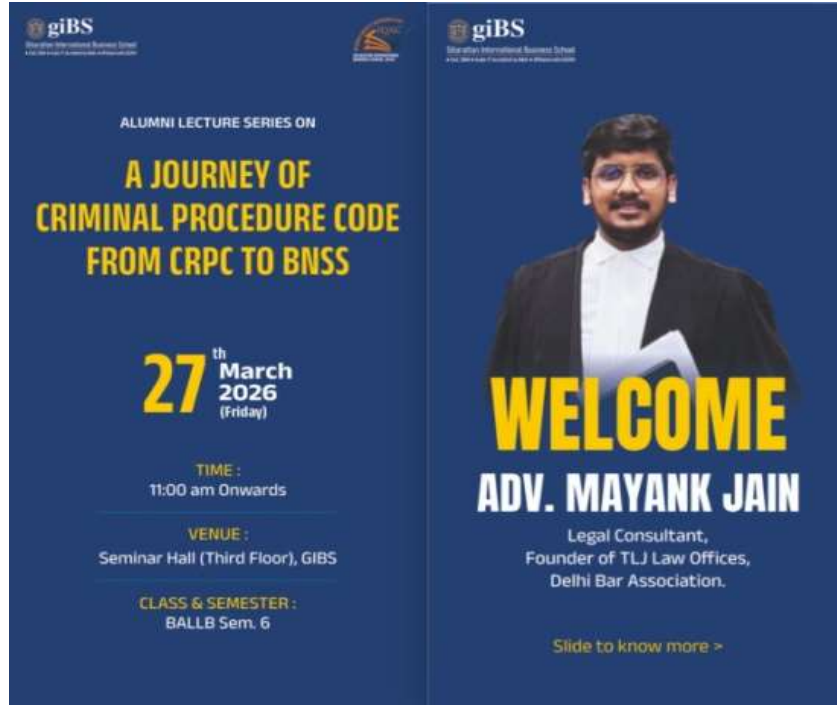
The Alumni Lecture Series (ALS), organized by Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS) on 27th March 2026, was conducted as part of the institute's continuous initiative to promote legal awareness, professional values, and responsible courtroom conduct among students. The session titled "A Journey of Criminal Procedure Code from CrPC to BNSS" aimed to make students aware about the importance of legal knowledge, practical aspects of Criminal law and professionalism in court room environments.

The session focused on helping students to understand the role of BNSS in criminal litigation and impact of New Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, in reshaping of whole Criminal Procedure. The emphasis is laid on the Changes brought by new Criminal Code that is BNSS 2023, how modern technology is incorporated in BNSS through concept of E-FIR, recording of statements and evidence through audio-video electronic means, use of electronic communication for summons, warrants and other processes.

The session was graced by Adv. Mayank Jain, an esteemed alumna of GIBS (BBA.LL.B 2018-2023 Batch). Drawing from his professional journey in litigation, legal consultation, and as founder of TLJ Law Offices and one of the panelist in Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD), he emphasized the significance of class room teaching, internships and further added college co-curricular activities plays a significant role in further future prospects for Litigation. He also explained how criminal law forms the very basis of Criminal legal Justice System, principles of criminal laws, how judicial decisions shaped the present criminal justice system and rights of accused person. He shared valuable insights on handling legal challenges, managing procedural part of litigation along with drafting & pleadings, and on balancing professional goals with personal values.

The session successfully achieved its objectives and expected outcomes. Students actively participated in the discussion and engaged with the resource person through thoughtful questions related to practical challenges and litigation expectations. The interactive session concluded with positive feedback from participants, who expressed interest in more such value-based alumni interactions in the future.
