

## “JEEV SANRAKSHAN- ANIMAL CARE HOSPITAL VISIT”

4TH MAY 2026 (MONDAY)



The NSS Unit of Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS) successfully organized an impactful social outreach activity titled “**JEEV SANRAKSHAN**” on 4th May 2026, in collaboration with Sanjay Gandhi Animal Care Centre (SGACC). The activity was conducted from 11:30 AM to 01:00 PM at the SGACC premises in Raja Garden, Delhi, with the objective of fostering compassion, empathy, and a sense of responsibility towards animals among students.

This initiative was conceptualized as part of the NSS Unit’s broader commitment to community service and social responsibility. The visit aimed not only to support animal welfare efforts but also to sensitize students about the ethical treatment of animals and the importance of coexistence with all living beings. In a rapidly urbanizing environment where animals are often neglected or mistreated, such initiatives play a crucial role in shaping humane and responsible citizens.

Upon arrival at the center, the NSS volunteers were warmly received by the dedicated staff of SGACC. The team provided a comprehensive orientation about the functioning of the organization, highlighting their efforts in rescuing injured, abandoned, and abused animals, providing medical treatment, rehabilitation, and ensuring their long-term care. The staff also shared insightful information about common challenges faced in animal welfare, including lack of awareness, insufficient resources, and increasing cases of animal cruelty.

During the visit, the volunteers were taken on a guided tour of the facility. They observed various sections where different animals, including dogs, cats, birds, and some farm animals, were being cared for. The students witnessed firsthand the medical treatment being administered to injured animals and the rehabilitation processes for those recovering from trauma or illness. This exposure provided a deeper understanding of the complexities involved in animal care and the dedication required to sustain such efforts.

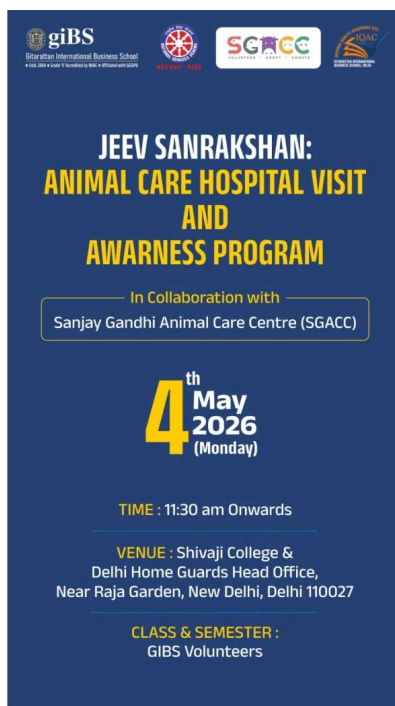
