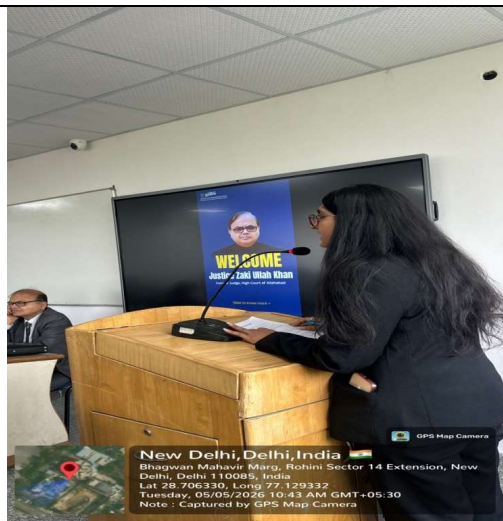


COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS AND PATHWAYS TO CAREER ADVANCEMENT IN LAW

The Career Advancement Programme (CAP) was organized by Gitarattan International Business School (GIBS), Delhi, with the objective of guiding law students towards informed career choices, particularly in the area of competitive examinations such as judiciary and other legal services. The programme reflects the institution's commitment to bridging the gap between academic learning and professional requirements by providing students with practical insights, expert guidance, and exposure to diverse career opportunities in the legal field.

The session provided a comprehensive glimpse into the evolving landscape of legal careers, with a focused discussion on judiciary preparation, competitive examinations, and practical aspects of the legal profession. This lecture highlighted the importance of conceptual clarity, disciplined preparation, and real-world understanding of law, supported by illustrations from his judicial experience, particularly in criminal matters.

The session was graced by Hon'ble Justice Zaki Ullah Khan, Former Judge, High Court of Allahabad, as the esteemed resource person. His presence added immense value to the programme, given his vast judicial experience and deep understanding of the legal system.

During the session, Justice Khan provided valuable insights into various career opportunities available to law graduates, with a special focus on judicial services examinations, particularly the Uttar Pradesh Judiciary, drawing from his experience at the Allahabad High Court. He explained the three-stage process of judiciary examinations (Prelims, Mains, and Interview) and emphasized the importance of bare act reading, clarity in core subjects such as IPC, CrPC, CPC, and Evidence Law, and regular answer writing practice.

He also elaborated upon alternative career options such as Law Officers (Assistant Public Prosecutor, Public Prosecutor, and Government Counsel), explaining their roles in representing the State, handling criminal prosecutions, and assisting courts in the administration of justice. Further, he discussed opportunities in litigation practice, highlighting the importance of court exposure, drafting

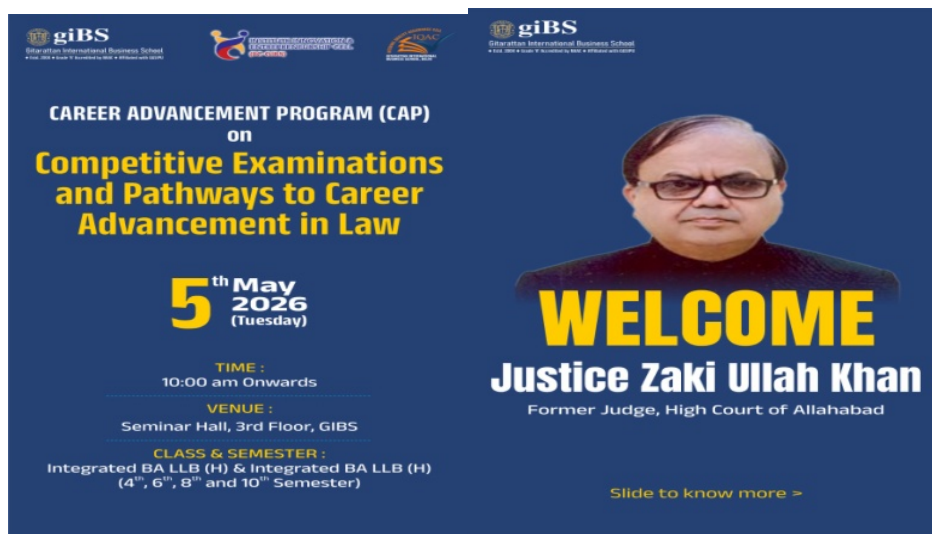
skills, and client handling, as well as roles in judicial clerking and legal research, which help in developing analytical and writing skills.

Drawing from his judicial experience, he stressed the importance of ethical conduct, impartiality, and a strong sense of responsibility in the legal profession. He also shared practical guidance on time management, preparation strategy, and maintaining consistency, advising students to focus on conceptual understanding rather than rote learning.

The programme successfully achieved its objective of creating awareness about competitive examinations and guiding students towards structured career planning in the legal field. It encouraged participants to view career advancement as a result of consistent effort, conceptual clarity, and informed decision-making. The session was efficiently coordinated by the organizing team, ensuring smooth conduct and active engagement throughout.
