

ACADEMIC VISIT TO
THE HON'BLE DISTRICT COURT
18TH AUGUST 2026 (TUESDAY)



A visit to the District Court, Rohini was organized by Centre for Legal Studies, Gitarattan International Business School wherein the students of BBA LLB I Semester were accompanied by Dr. Shreya Bharadwaj and Mr. Sagar Mural Assistant Professor, giBS.

The academic visit to the Hon'ble District Court, Rohini proved to be a highly enriching, informative, and insightful experience for the students. The visit was organised with the objective of providing students with practical exposure to the functioning of the judicial system and enabling them to understand the application of legal principles in real-life situations. It provided an opportunity for the students to move beyond theoretical learning and gain first-hand knowledge of court procedures, judicial proceedings, legal aid mechanisms, and the overall functioning of the justice delivery system.

During the course of the visit, the students had the opportunity to attend proceedings in two Family Courtrooms. Observing the proceedings enabled them to understand the practical functioning of Family Courts and the nature of matters dealt with before them. The students observed the manner in which cases are presented, the interaction between the parties and legal representatives, and the conduct of proceedings within the courtroom. This exposure helped them appreciate the importance of judicial discipline, courtroom decorum, procedural safeguards, and sensitivity while dealing with family-related disputes.

The students were subsequently taken to the Office of the Legal Aid Defence Counsel, where they were introduced to the structure, functioning, hierarchy, and responsibilities of the Legal Aid Defence Counsel system. The interaction provided valuable insight into the manner in which legal aid services are organised and delivered to individuals who may not have adequate financial resources to secure legal representation. The students gained an understanding of the role of legal aid counsel and the importance of providing effective legal assistance to persons who require support within the justice system.

The students were also briefed about the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA), its objectives, and its role in promoting access to justice. The discussion enabled them to understand the significance of legal services institutions in assisting vulnerable and disadvantaged sections of

society. It further highlighted the importance of ensuring that financial or social circumstances do not become barriers to obtaining legal assistance and appropriate legal remedies.

Owing to the students' active participation and keen interest, special permission was obtained for them to visit the Vulnerable Witness Deposition Complex. This provided them with an opportunity to understand a specialised component of the judicial system designed to facilitate the deposition of vulnerable witnesses in an appropriate, secure, and supportive environment.

At the Vulnerable Witness Deposition Complex, the students were apprised of the purpose, significance, and functioning of the facility. They were also given an understanding of the manner in which proceedings involving vulnerable witnesses are conducted. The visit helped them appreciate the importance of protecting the dignity, safety, privacy, and well-being of vulnerable witnesses while ensuring that the principles of a fair and effective judicial process are maintained.

The practical exposure gained during the visit complemented the students' academic learning and provided them with a broader understanding of the functioning of courts and allied legal institutions. It enabled them to observe how various components of the justice delivery system work together to facilitate the administration of justice. The experience also demonstrated that the legal profession extends beyond courtroom advocacy and encompasses responsibilities relating to access to justice, legal assistance, protection of vulnerable persons, and service to society.

The visit further encouraged the students to reflect upon the ethical and social dimensions of the legal profession. They gained a deeper appreciation of the responsibility of legal professionals towards individuals who may face financial, social, or other barriers in accessing justice. The experience reinforced the understanding that legal education is not limited to the study of statutes, precedents, and legal principles, but also involves understanding the human, institutional, and social dimensions of justice.

Overall, the visit to the Hon'ble District Court, Rohini was a valuable experiential learning opportunity. It provided the students with meaningful practical exposure to courtroom proceedings, Family Court functioning, the Legal Aid Defence Counsel system, NALSA, and the Vulnerable

Witness Deposition Complex. The visit broadened their understanding of the justice delivery mechanism and strengthened their appreciation of professional ethics, courtroom conduct, access to justice, and the social responsibilities associated with the legal profession.

The experience left the students with a greater sense of respect for the judicial process and a deeper awareness of the role of law in promoting justice, equality, fairness, dignity, and access to legal remedies. The visit therefore served as an important bridge between classroom-based legal education and practical understanding, making it a highly valuable and memorable academic experience for the students.
