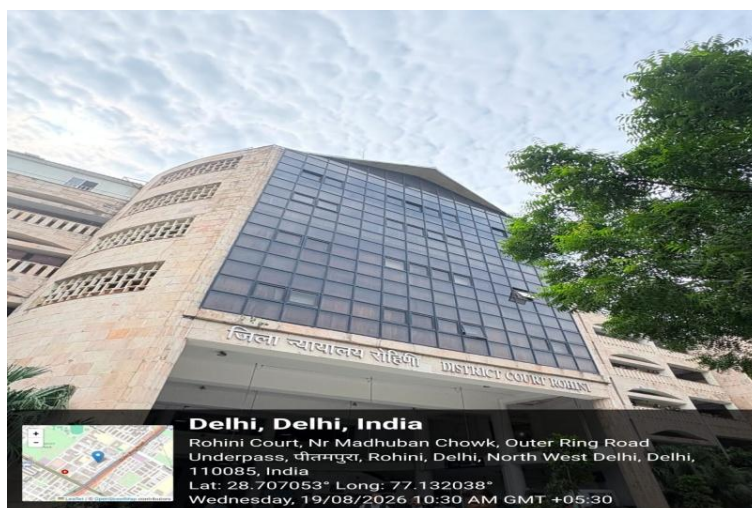
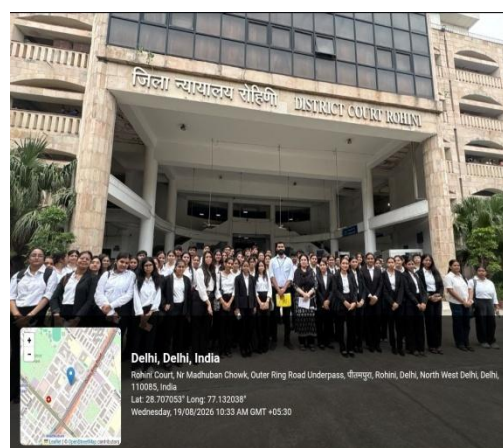
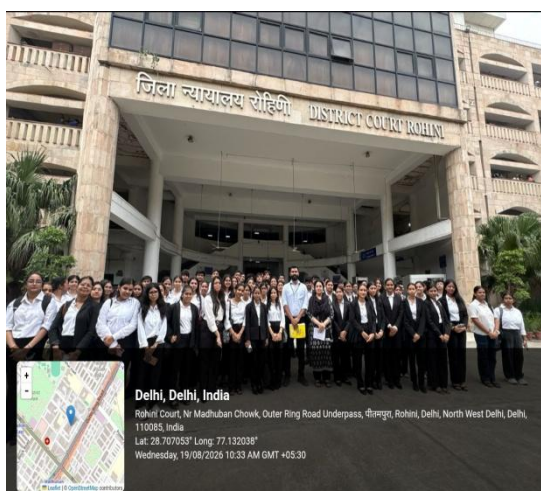


ACADEMIC VISIT

19TH AUGUST 2026 (WEDNESDAY)



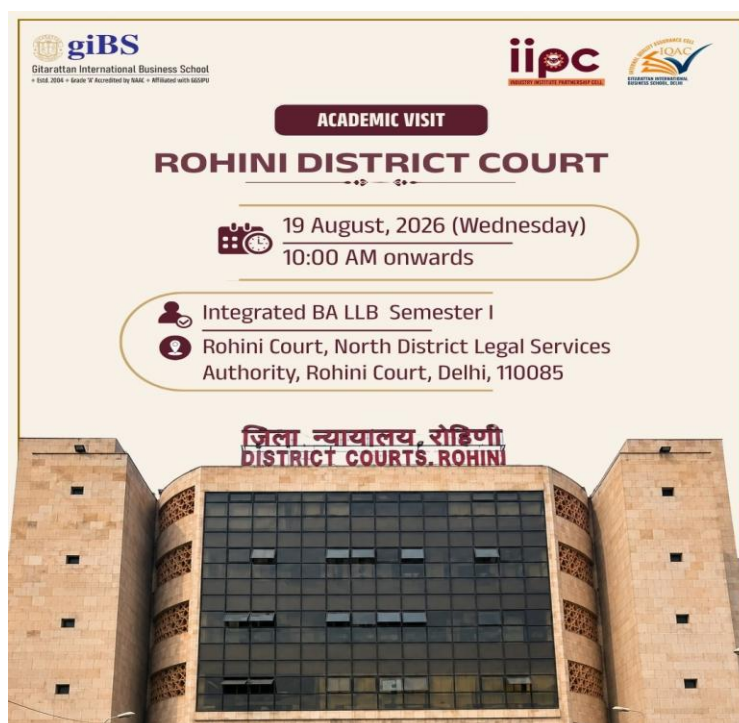
Centre for Legal Studies, GIBS organized an academic visit to the Rohini District Court, Delhi, for the first-semester students of the B.A. LL.B. and B.B.A. LL.B. programmes. The visit was organized with the objective of providing students with meaningful exposure to the functioning of the judicial system and enabling them to connect classroom learning with practical legal processes.

During the visit, the students had the opportunity to observe the proceedings of the Principal District & Sessions Judge's Court, the Mahila Court, and the Family Court. The exposure enabled them to understand the functioning and jurisdiction of different courts, courtroom decorum, the roles and responsibilities of judicial officers and advocates, and the manner in which cases are presented and adjudicated.

The visit was particularly significant for first-semester students, as it provided an early introduction to the practical dimensions of law and the administration of justice. Observing actual court proceedings helped students appreciate the importance of procedural law, judicial discipline, professional ethics, and access to justice. The proceedings before the Mahila Court and Family Court also sensitized students to the distinct legal and social considerations involved in matters concerning women, matrimonial disputes, and family relationships.

The academic visit successfully achieved its intended objectives by enhancing students' practical understanding, legal awareness, observational skills, and professional orientation. It encouraged students to engage more meaningfully with their academic curriculum and develop a deeper appreciation of the role of courts in upholding the rule of law and delivering justice.

Overall, the visit was an enriching and valuable experiential learning opportunity that complemented classroom teaching and contributed significantly to the holistic legal education of the participating students.
