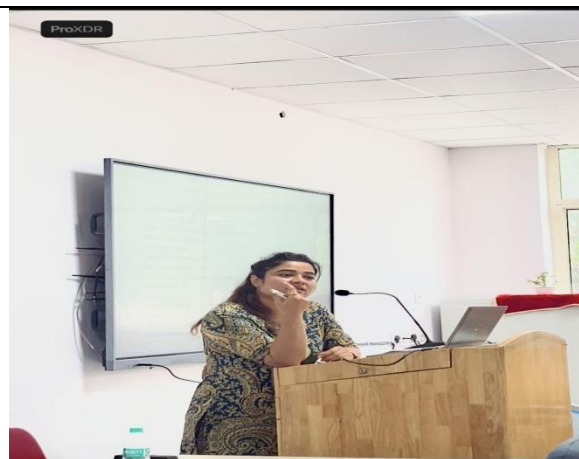
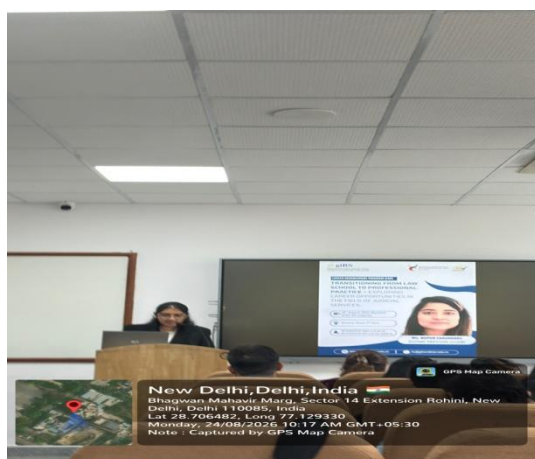


CAREER ADVANCEMENT PROGRAM (CAP)
‘TRANSITIONING FROM LAW SCHOOL TO PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE – EXPLORING CAREER OPPORTUNITIES IN THE FIELD OF JUDICIAL SERVICES’
24TH AUGUST 2026 (MONDAY)



The Centre for Legal Studies (CLS), Gitarattan International Business School successfully organized a Career Advancement Program (CAP) for the students of 9th Semester on 24th August 2026 at the Seminar Room, 3rd Floor, GIBS. The session was conducted on the title “Transitioning from Law School to Professional Practice – Exploring Career Opportunities in the Field of Judicial Services.” The event was designed to prepare law students for professional practice by creating awareness about Judicial Services and bridging the gap between academic learning and competitive legal careers.

The session was delivered by Ms. Nupur Chaudhary, a dedicated legal academic with expertise in Constitutional Law, Criminal Law, Family Law, and contemporary legal developments.

The event commenced with a formal welcome of the Resource Person, followed by her introduction and felicitation. The session was conducted in an interactive manner, encouraging students to actively participate and understand the practical aspects of preparing for Judicial Services.

Highlights of the Session

Delhi Judicial Services Examination Pattern

Ms. Nupur Chaudhary provided a comprehensive overview of the Delhi Judicial Services Examination, explaining each stage of the selection process. She informed students that the overall weightage of the Judiciary examination is 1000 marks, comprising:

Stage	Details
Preliminary Examination	200 Marks • 12 Law Subjects + General Knowledge & Language • 0.25 Negative Marking • Duration: 2 Hours 30 Minutes
Mains Examination	850 Marks • Expected Cut-off: 550–600 Marks
Interview	150 Marks

She emphasized that understanding the examination pattern is the first step towards effective preparation.

Interactive Learning Through Sample Questions

To make the session practically engaging, students were given sample judicial examination questions to solve. The discussion of these questions helped students understand the style of objective and descriptive questions, legal reasoning, and the analytical approach expected in judicial examinations.

Guidance for Judiciary Preparation

The Resource Person guided students on developing a disciplined study plan for Judicial Services. She advised aspirants to focus on conceptual clarity rather than rote learning and encouraged consistent revision, answer writing practice, and regular reading of Bare Acts and landmark judgments.

Core Subjects to Master

She highlighted that the following subjects form the foundation of Judicial Services preparation and must receive maximum attention:

- Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS)
- Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS)
- Bharatiya Sakshya Adhinyam (BSA)
- Constitutional Law

According to her, strong command over these core subjects significantly improves performance in both prelims and mains examinations.

Understanding Legal Terminologies

An important part of the session focused on legal terminology frequently asked in judicial examinations. She explained the doctrine of Res Sub Judice, clarifying that it refers to a case that is already pending before a competent court, thereby helping students connect procedural law with its practical application.

Comparative Discussion on State Judiciary Examinations

Students were introduced to the differences in examination patterns across various States. Ms. Chaudhary explained that Rajasthan Judiciary has one of the lengthiest syllabus among judicial examinations and discussed the varying duration and timing of mains examinations conducted by different State Judicial Services.

Preparation for General Knowledge & Translation Papers

The Resource Person advised students to develop a daily newspaper reading habit and specifically recommended - The Hindu Editorial for improving General Knowledge, comprehension, vocabulary, and legal awareness.

She also discussed the importance of the translation paper in the Mains Examination, where candidates are required to translate passages from English to Hindi and Hindi to English. For systematic preparation, she recommended the book Legal Translation Workbook as a useful resource for mastering legal translation.

Interactive Question & Answer Session

The event concluded with an engaging Question & Answer session, during which students sought guidance on:

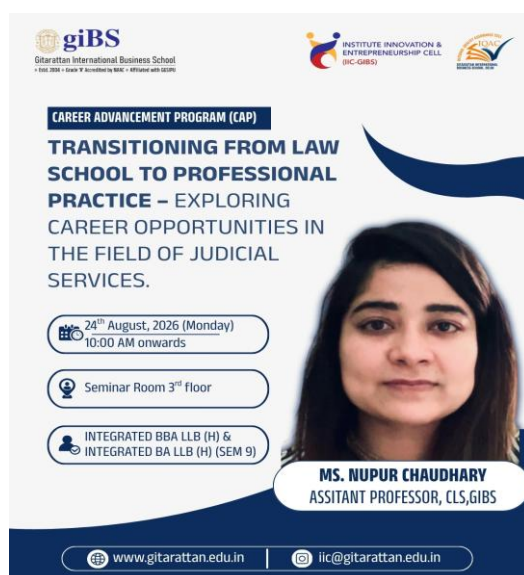
- Effective strategy for Delhi Judicial Services preparation
- Time management during prelims and mains examinations
- Choosing the right study resources
- Improving answer writing and translation skills
- Balancing semester studies with judicial examination preparation

The Resource Person addressed each query with practical examples and encouraged students to begin preparation early with consistency and discipline.
